ANTI-APARTHEID organisers ~ here claim to have pulled off a-stunning propaganda coup by smuggling a message from jailed African National Congress leader Nelson Mandela off Robben Island.

The message, said to be two pages long, will be read publicly at the House .of Commons here on Wednesday: to mark his 16th year in detention.

Supporters of the Anti-Apartheid Movement and â\200\230the ANC in London will also picket the African Embassy in

- Trafalgar Square on Wednesday and attend the meeting in a hired hall at the Commons.

The smuggled message-

comes. at the height of an intense campaign here to release - the prisoner \hat{a} 200\224 and is bound to be seen as a slap in the face for the South African authorities.

The gesture follows hard $\hat{a}\200\230$ on_the blasting of petrol! tanks at Sasolburg, which { was also aimed at causing red Government faces.

in London on Tuesday
