Re: SDNAFCD STUDENTS an Nordic Tour

we hereby wish to inform you that a group of six SOMAFCD students are due to arrive in Copenhagen January 6th, 1985. They are invited and sponsored by all the Nordic Pupils' organisations for public relations' work in connection with Operation Day's Work. Apart from speaking in many schools on Apartheid Education and SOMAFCD, they will give a cultural performance. The entire tour will last for about three months.

Plans for their coming were discussed with the Director, Comrade Tikly, in March and again in October 1984. We received the list of participants from the school on the 3rd December 1984. On the 24th December Comrade Tim Maseko informed us that Cde Mohammad Jahathan Ulll lead them because "as a rule" students are accompanied by a teacher. If we sound ridiculous in saying we cannot expect to find a sponsor at this eleventh hour, there are sound reasons. What can we do on Christmas Eve? The region has been on holiday since 21st December till January the 3rd. Within Scandinavia, students travel on student and Youth rates. We have had students from SOMAFCD unaccompanied before in the area because of tacit confidence in the ability of the office and solidarity people to handle eventualities. Ideally, it would be good to have a teacher, especially

lane that would be involved in the program. For practical, financial reasons and in our unldaal situation we will look more ridiculous ta lntroduce the 7th person when all countries spilled and received funding on a budget for six. Us do have a lot 0? other work and problems to cape ulth. Besides, when you asked us to make arghgemants for Comrade Mohammad last Aprll/May, tha questian of his eye treatment was an emergency - urgent. Almost a year later, he can only expect to get treatment after the tour.

Us still expect him in Sweden as a Doctar uas alerted last May of his condition. Ede Mastko has also asked that us arrange For Ede Mohammad to visit some of the schonls in Sweden that have been assisting SDMAFCU, after his treatment. Us have welcomed this reasonable suggestion though it will have to be financed exclusively fram our office administration funds, basidss not been budgeted for. It is essential that we consolidate these relatians.

It appaars that me are failing to make our difficult position clear with Ede Maaeko and therefore turn the matter aver to you: miss counabl.
