b) H.H.O. Donation:

0) A.F.S.C. Contribwkion: .

In a lettcr dated the 25th May,1979, The American
Friends Service Oumnittoe contributed towards a fund to give incentive
to 2 full-time nurses in East Africa at the rate of 500 Shillings for
the period of June 1979 to May 1980. Thin lsuuo had been raised in a
meeting of the Medical Committoo held in January 1979 in view of the
fact that incentives are also to be offered to teachers at Mazimbu.

On this issue incentives or allowances, it was felt that it is high time the National Executive Committee took a clear stand particularly because we anticipate growth, both in number and profile of cadre in highly qualified professions. Comrade Nkambi promised to take up the issue at high level.

2. Aid Requisition

3.

It was felt that the turnover of work requires further strengthening. We have at least advanced to the stage of requisition: made to various solidarity groups are copied to the Treasury and all a donation received. However, this still leaves certain loopholes in the Treasury attempt to have a record of all our funds either in money form or in any kind.

A new procedure therefore has to be followed:

- 1) Our needs and requirements may be discussed by any department with its counter-organisation. However, when it comes to submission of a loan-out requisition, this has to be done through the Treasury.
- 2) All material received by the organisation (ABC) will be received through the machinery of the Treasury (Logistics).
- 3) The Treasury undertakes to ensure that requisitions from any department will not suffer delay in reaching their destination.
- 4) The Logistics Department undertakes to inform the relevant departments of the arrival of the material destined for them as well as its source.

SOMAFCO:

a) School Fund:

The question of creation of a special fund for the school under the jurisdiction of the Principal has been approved and the money actually deposited to this fund. This fund will be used mainly for academic and administrative needs or to cope up with some other form of emergency.

b) Loathing:

The needs pertaining to supplies and equipment will remain
the responsibility of the Logistic! Unit within the Team.
