As per your request on the phone yesterday I am sending you our revised proposal for 1994 & 1995. Our letter dated 11 August

. These revised budgets take into account inflation, increased number of returnees (especially from Uganda & Zimbabwe) and in the case of the SOMAFCO Research Project, please refer to John Samuel's letter which is attached.

Please note that this request does not include the needs of the diminishing external bursary programme for which in our proposal dated 14 December 1994 we requested US \$165,986-00.

Since we accept SIDA's position on the children in Swaziland, we are deleting that country from our proposal for external assistance. The amount of funds requested for Uganda has also been reduced because AIDAB has agreed to provide part of the funds. Thus, the funds required are as follows:-

We obviously cannot assist them with their general needs but wish to be able to meet the edugational requirements for at least 3000 returnees. They are grateful to SIDA for its concerned support for them. The entire bursary' programme for 1994 & 1995 rests heavily on SIDA's assistance. We hope that by the end of 1995 the soon-to-be elected democratic government of South Africa will be in a position to restructure the educational system & attempt to attend to the educational needs of returnees & all South African learners.
