It gives me great pleasure to invite you and your guests to attend the Spring Convocation of Osgoode Hall Law School of York University. The Convocation ceremony will be held on Friday 16 June 1989 at 2:30 p.m., at the site immediately north of the Steacie Science Building on the York campus. A reception, to which you and your guests are most warmly invited, will follow Convocation on the Terrace between Osgoode Hall Law School and the Administrative Studies Building.

At the ceremony, the University will bestow the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws on Mr. Justice Walter Tarnopolsky of the Ontario Court of Appeal. Mr. Justice Tarnopolsky, a former professor at Osgoode Hall Law School and a noted international human rights expert, will deliver the Convocation address. In addition, the University has issued an invitation to Dr. Nelson Mandela to receive an honorary degree *in absentia*. Students who are taking part in the Convocation ceremony should pick up their robes after 11:00 a.m. in the East Bear Pit, Central Square, Ross Building, and should be present in Curtis Lecture Hall L, no later than 1:30 p.m., for marshalling. If you are unable to attend the Convocation ceremony and reception, you are requested to notify the Registrar's Office at 736-5042, no later than June 13th.
