A sub-committee, of myself, Doodles, Moteumi and Preston are to meet soon, mainly to hammer Preston about all the things he does not comply with. 6.8. I have had no lists,of goods, nameeof done ore, bills of lading or anything else to enable me to propezly thank and acknowledge donors. Also, once again, in the usual slap happy way garments are distributed to some and not to others. no thought.being given to the Dar coqredee, etc. Perhaps another good shake up is needed. I can report the following arrivals: 9 certone of goods from Lore Gollwitzer - West Germany (AAB groups and Evangelical church) These came by post and consisted mainly of second-hand children: clothes, three large tins of baby food and some toys etc for the nursery school. I thanked and acknowledged. Apparently more is on the way from them. We have had a large consignement of food from the GDR, but '50 far I have no details. Also masses and masses of bales of 2nd. hand clothing from SIDA at Bikwa. Again I have had no official notification.

I recently did a distribution of shoes to all the children at Morogoro/Mazimbu (Der had received theirs earlier). This went off very smoothly. We took the shoes to the Nursery and Primary school and fitted the kids there. Then I went off to the Charlottes and Piggery. The Ilala and Tabora families whose kids do not attend our schools came on a Saturday morning to the school—so everyqpe was fixed up.

V Motsumi, with the help of Mazimbu Store staff is sorting the SIDA stuff into childrens, men and womens lots for the next .distribution. I haven't yet worked out a media operandi for the adults but am working on it. We will distribute to the children first... -

The cigaretteS'are selling well at Mazimbu, but I think not in Morogoro or Dar. Our comrades - many of them-are fussy and obviously prefer to buy on the black market. .

Several cartons and boxes accompanied Shanthie on the plane. I have not properly looked into them. but they appear to be mainly children's wens. This was sent from the London office and I will acknowledge as soon as I know-what has come.

The principal passed over to me the school file dealing with donors, so I have been able to rationalise these all in one file and wrote letters to various-people where I could not find they had been acknowledged.

I am feelihg quite bucked as the first project I worked on – a chicken hatchery – has been funded bleXFAM Canada to the tune of \$20,000 and one on the piggery has been passed on by them to another organisation for funding. 6 projects. similarly sent to CUSO now await results. ''I

Terry Bell and myself worked on a brochure for school . children and this has been sent off to Lindiwe for printing in _ Sweden for their special_school fund raising day. She also offerf led to print for other countries.
