LOGISTICS MONTHLY REPORT.

The department is functioning well presently, except that it's still faced with the problem of transporting foodstuffs from Mazimbu to Dakawa. We still need to have our own truck which will serve also in emergencies. We once again appeal to the Zonal Administration, to try and pressurise the Regional Aministration to let our department to have it's own truck stationed here in Dakawa. The truck should be based here so 'that we can use whenever we want to buy charcoal and some other i &logistical needs.

The Administration is being made aware that the comrades escorting the supplies truck have a low morle since the problems they face i.e : sometimes when they get the supplies, they have to struggle to get a truck to bring the supplies to Dakawa. This problem has existed since last year. We feel that it is unhealthy to transport vegitables/fruits with the ISIGULUMBA BECAUSE it is ment specifically for patients, and this can also lead to the speedy breakdown of the truck. In faxt this type of truck is not good when it comes to the packing of bags etc. Lastly, foodstuff's are satisfying nowadays, except that Mazimbu E (finds it difficult to get the vegitables and fruits from the suppliAK. They even drive up to Mbeya to look for these things. The distance between Mbeya and Morogoro, plus the rains also contributes to the things getting rotten/spoiled, and this also creates misunderstandings between the logistic members and the community. People always complain about us supplying them bad food. We usually try to explain the main cause of this and nobody can just accept that so easily. We hope that after the rains th situation will improve.

Without any hesitation Ode Maya replace Ode Profusor with new blankets. Upon his arrival in WWA, he went about telling people that the thing of our saying there weren't blankets in Hazimbtl was tantamount to fighting a loosing battle. In u'otuel that he told m.ty that he wont win the battle, simply meaning that Me was the person to sun the problem: of the Comunity of DAKAWA end not Elty. end this was evident that Ma and Helm don't recognise mty. lent mt their Mo. m house felt that somebody met Mappointled as chief of Logistics 0! the zone. may he the person who will satisfy Mum and Dam. he question was left to the Administration for reconsideration. /ZI..OI.

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On the question of appointing a new Logistical secretary to relieve Bandile. the house suggested Ode Tbeh. The reasone being that Sandile has got a let o: Job to do in plot 15. He runs the tuck shop and at the sane time he 13 a logistic. officer in the residence. For progress sake. Cde Tbeh was appointed an that report. from the meanings should reach the oo-ordinatore office as loan as possible. Uhder the problem at not herein our own transport the heuee felt that there wa- nothing new except that the rent was that we might be given a truck tery noon but this would depend on how the transport allocation committee, of which Halule 1- the head if not a member views the seriousness of our being desperately in need of one. Because since we have been discussing this problem npthins premieeing happended.

Again, foodstuff! turn to be insufficent in residence: although not all of them. Residence euch ac Mohlaba, where pheychiatric comradea are based. has to be supplied for with enough mielie-meal as it serves not only fbr lunch and supper. but 1hr breekthet also. Fbr these mentally derranged Cdee swallow drugs which make them to eat more. So if insufficient thod is supplied. it will be difficult for the Ode. to respond to their treatment. Plot 18 must at least be given 30 base of m/heal per month. The reason being that the number of residents does fletuate tremendously. And when Elty approaches Khaya about this problem he 15 alloys diamieaed like they did on the 5/02/86 when they told him that the people eell thod in Dakawa. Yes there are those of us who might be doing so, but not all the people. Comrades were advioed not to sell feed as coercive measures could be instituted against those who might be carrying out this sort of trade. An appeal was also fbrwarded to residents to oo-Operate with the people responsible tbr escorting the supplies truck in oflladins CIII fbodetuffh yr?Finmediately upon arrival from Mazimbu. Cdee leave the task of of! loading on their logistics officers. under the hmpreeeion that they are being paid fbr exoutins such duties, forgetting that their logistics are the people who lead these fbodatuffh in Mazimbu. The community is still discontented with their normal charcoal supplies. This time Thando was supposed to have bought 100 bags of charcoal. But instead he hought 70 bagI. When Zola was asked about the other 30 bags. as he in the distributing officer. he told the house that he doesn't know anytlins as he who only told about the 70 bags that was bought by Thando and further went on to explain that the ieaaon for not buying hundred bags. according to what he wan told by Thando, was that the truck they used was too small. The resolution adopted was that since Thando not a Chief of Logistics, he can only get get money from the treasurer and therafter notify the logistical department as soon as the tunes are available so that the Chief of Logistics should be in the position of arranging transport with Mose, as to when these charcoal could be

bought. In the past, the families in plot 16 were able to buy themselves char. coal in case of emogoncy and they were refunded, but nowadays that's no longer the case. They are being refund with their monies, we don't know how truthmll that h. A. than charcoul was meat for rainy seasons, we don't understand the rmon why families and other emmdea in general should encounter problems when tiny are supposed to be getting m rights. We hope and trust that a follow up in thin reopect will made so as to alleviate problems concerning what has already been dealt with.

Answering Ode naseko said though there was no report inconnection with that study tour, the whole idea was still part and p-roel of the Nutritional seminor which was held in Mazimbu. Cde Evelyn then said the Committee which was to be elected should

be consist of personnel from treasury, Medical team, agriculture and Catering.

At that stage Cde Maseko suggested that before election the

At that stage Cde Maseko suggested that before election the participants should first state the functions of the said committee. The house agreed with Cde Maseko.

Cde Evelyn suggested that the first function should be:(a) To look into the nutritional level of the community including both adults and children. She continued to say that on several occassions especially in Mazimbu there was a tendency of negecting the adults when it came to supply of certain commodities. She went on to say even Mr Semiti had said that he had noticed some mild malnutrition amongst adults within Mazimbu during his evaluation

Answering Cde Khaya said thegnegligence on the question of adults was not deliberate, it was because the first pregence always went to children especially when there was a shortage of some certain commodities. He went on to say it also depended on the budget at that particular moment. Cde Evelyn said that the cut off of imporb tant commodities was usually too long as a result there were many cases of T.b. and other diseases caused by the lack of certain commodities. Cde Khaya said as he had pointed out that that was not deliberate the other reason was that the faxm.was not producing enough. He went on to say that in his department they had been trying to get some milk and the producers of milk could not supply sufficient amount of milk that was required within Mazimbu. He said they had managed to get eggs in bult and he said he; was hoping that it would continue that way. He went on to say that t the nutritional committe should advise the treasury as well as the supply according to the needs of the community. He said he had gone to the Market in Morogoro on several occasions he had not seen things like spinaroh, letis and so on. He said the producers sins ply sold what they had.

Cde Maseko said the buying of fruits and vegetable at present was not economical. He said formerly the people who used to do purh chasing used to go to the maountains whenever there was any transport avaible. and they would get some vegetable and fruits at a cheaper price than in Morogoro Market.

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Cde Maseko said he would rather suggest that instead of the organisation to ask for funds from CIDA he would prefer thp?,asked for commodities that was not available in Tanzania. He said the work of the Nutritional Committee should also to work hand in had with such organisations and deal directly with them id possible not through Lusaka.

Ode Sandile said the Committee should first look into what commodities were available in Mazimbu and also with the help of the agridulture, things that could be produced in the farm before making a request of any commodities from the donners. He continued to say that the f Committee should see t9 it that the farm is revived. Vegetables and fruits that could be of importance in the diet should be grown. Ode malums answering said it is true that we did get some funds from CIDA. But CIDA was not the only organisation that was donating there were many others. He said though he did not see the reason why we did not produce our own vegetables and fruits from the farm. He said our people were lazy, they did not want to work. He further said that even we could rear a lot of cattle to produce milk enough to feed the community. He said even eggs for that matter he did not see why the community whould stay without them.

Thereafter the election took place, the following comrades were appointed to form a nutritional committee:-

After the election of the committee there was a question of whom was the Committee going to be answerable. Ode Elen Maseko said that she had thoughrthat the normal proc edurewas to expect the Nutritional Committee after some progress to report back to the people tho had participated in the seminar. It was finally agreed that Ode Khaya as a member or the directorate will be answerable to_them and as well as the Newly appointed Nutritional Committee will be expected to report back to the same comrades who had appointed 1; hem.

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Cde Maseko said that the last year's Christmas was a black one to the children because they did not enjoy it. He said special treatment should be given to the children on this particular day and it should be the work of the Committee to arrange such trips and parties for

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the chll r431 on days like that.

Cde Malume/said the former office of RPC was being converted into a shop which would specially serve the community. He said the shop would sell beers and things like (Umqombothi) and other small commodities. He said since the members of the Community were no longer allowed to go to town and that would also include Dakawa. Cde Jones said it had taken a long time for the meeting to meet after the Nutrition seminor was held he said thatwas causgiby poor attendency, comrades were not ready to come to the meeting. He appealed to the members of the said committee to be serious with their work. He continued to say that during the seminor he had pointed out the question of storage in Dakawa that the conditions were too poor. He said in some residents in Dakawa where one would find that all the people living there were students and did not have time to prepare their foqi properly. The preparation of good food was almost n11. He said whilst the committee was carrying on its duties on nutrition he would also recommend and appeal to them to look into the problems in Dakawa in particular. Ode Malume answering said arrangement of storage were on the way and he said they were also thinking of getting a generator for Dakawa. Ode Maseko said he would recommend that the personnel in the kitchens be trained so that theyW should be able to prepare good food. He said most kitchens the food 3e badLy prepared. He continued to say that in the nutrition seminor a suggestion had been made that the personnel in the kitchen be trained on crush programmes. Answering Cde Natso taid arrangement were on the way to organise courses for the kitchen staff. She said not only for Mazimbu but for Dakawa and Darkes-Slaam respectively. The meeting was declared closed at 11.30 a.m.
