LOGISTICS MONTHLY REPORT.

The department is functioning well presently, except that it's still faced with the problem of transporting foodstuffs from Mazimbu to Dakawa. We still need to have our own truck which will serve also in emergencies. We once again appeal to the Zonal Administration, to try and pressurise the Regional Administration to let our department to have it's own truck stationed here in Dakawa. The truck should be based here so that we can use whenever we want to buy charcoal and some other logistical needs.

The Administration is being made aware that the comrades escorting the supplies truck have a low morale since the problems they face i.e : sometimes when they get the supplies, they have to struggle to get a truck to bring the supplies to Dakawa. This problem has existed since last year. We feel that it is unhealthy to transport vegetables/fruits with the ISIGULUMBA BECAUSE it is meant specifically for patients, and this can also lead to the speedy breakdown of the truck. In fact this type of truck is not good when it comes to the packing of bags etc.

Lastly, foodstuff's are satisfying nowadays, except that Mazimbu E (finds it difficult to get the vegetables and fruits from the suppliers. They even drive up to Mbeya to look for these things. The distance between Mbeya and Morogoro, plus the rains also contributes to the things getting rotten/spoiled, and this also creates misunderstandings between the logistic members and the community. People always complain about us supplying them bad food. We usually try to explain the main cause of this and nobody can just accept that so easily. We hope that after the rains the situation will improve.

Wanda 111:: reported in the meeting that it 1: high time the new Chief of Logistics be found because of his not being recognised by MALONE Ind KHAYA. e When he goes to' Hezhbu to get things like Tampa, Hatroeae. Cups. Dishes eat. his voice is not being listened to. Halume simply dismisses him and tell him 1 that he (lulu we) know: 'Bxando an Ohio! of Logistics of DAKAWA and not (mty). The question was difficult for the house and was alluded to Cde H030 who in turn told us that he would refer it to his Administration as he could not tell us on the spot the person decided upon C as the Ohio! to be at the time when the case of Ode mantle as a Chief of Logistics resulted in him being 9% eupercede by 0&0 Elty. In addition ti the problems Ode mty faces, he has to excort the supply trucker: certain days and when he's not doing that he also has to attend to some of the duties that affect the omnity of DAKAWA. Another case which reflected to u. that Elty 13 being undermined by the. Odes of mzmm is that of Ode Proffeeor '2'; resident of plot 22. This Dde's blankets were torn off. He reported the case to to his Logistics funtionnry and when when he was told that the peeple of Muzimbu refused us with blankets, he tocak them and went to demand new ones from Khan. Without any hesitation Ode Maya replace Ode Profusor with new blankets. Upon his arrival in WWA, he went about telling people that the thing of our saying there weren't blankets ln Hazimbt1 was tantamount to fighting a loosing battle. In u'otuel that he told m.ty that he wont win the battle, simply meaning that Me was the person to sun the problem: of the Comunity of DAKAWA end not Elty. end this was evident that Ma and Helm don't recognise mty. lent mt their Mo. m house felt that somebody met Mappointled as chief of Logistics 0! the zone. may he the person who will satisfy Mum and Dam. he question was left to the Administration for reconsideration.

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On the question of appointing a new Logistical secretary to relieve Bandile. the house suggested Ode Tbeh. The reason being that Sandile has got a lot of Job to do in plot 15. He runs the tuck shop and at the same time he is a logistic officer in the residence. For progress sake. Ode Tbeh was appointed on that report. from the meanings should reach the co-ordinators office as soon as possible. Under the problem at not herein our own transport the house felt that there was nothing new except that the rent was that we might be given a truck very soon but this would depend on how the transport allocation committee, of which Halule is the head if not a member views the seriousness of our being desperately in need of one. Because since we have been discussing this problem nothing premature happened.

Again, foodstuff! turn to be insufficient in residence: although not all of them. Residence such as Mhlaba, where physicians comrades are based. has to be supplied with enough mealie-meal as it serves not only for lunch and supper. but also for breakfast. For these mentally deranged comrades swallow drugs which make them to eat more. So if insufficient food is supplied. it will be difficult for the Ode. to respond to their treatment. Plot 18 must at least be given 30 bags of mealie-meal per month. The reason being that the number of residents does fluctuate tremendously. And when Elty approaches Khaya about this problem he allows diameters like they did on the 5/02/86 when they told him that the people eat food in Dakawa. Yes there are those of us who might be doing so, but not all the people. Comrades were advised not to sell food as coercive measures could be instituted against those who might be carrying out this sort of trade. An appeal was also forwarded to residents to co-operate with the people responsible for escorting the supplies truck in off-limits CIII foodstuff for? Immediately upon arrival from Mazimbu. comrades leave the task of off-loading on their logistics officers. under the impression that they are being paid for executing such duties, forgetting that their logistics are the people who lead these foodstuffs in Mazimbu. The community is still discontented with their normal charcoal supplies. This time Thando was supposed to have bought 100 bags of charcoal. But instead he bought 70 bags. When Zola was asked about the other 30 bags. as he is the distributing officer. he told the house that he doesn't know anything as he only told about the 70 bags that was bought by Thando and further went on to explain that the reason for not buying hundred bags. according to what he was told by Thando, was that the truck they used was too small. The resolution adopted was that since Thando is not a Chief of Logistics, he can only get money from the treasurer and thereafter notify the logistical department as soon as the funds are available so that the Chief of Logistics should be in the position of arranging transport with Mose, as to when these charcoal could be 0.....

bought. In the past. the families in plot 16 were able to buy themselves char. coal in case of emogoncy and they were refunded. but nowadays that's no longer the case. 'tiah The food problem is still not solved since the fuel origin in the country. Some commodities are not yet available such as flour, oil, sugar, rice and sheep, and Mzulbe is the oil in Uesinhu presently is or was brought from Holland. Rice is also there now in Hesihu. Sheep is the main meat although not in abundance, but in town there there is no soap - still a problem. Eggs are also difficult to obtain these days because of the shortage of the feeding in the ohiokeen-Ileh. Meat is hard to get differences with the vegetables and fruit - Suppliers. 80 there will be an end of! deliveries of them. Deknwe - still only 10 bags of beans monthly 3 although that does not suffice due to the population increase. We always have to find a way to cover up to the end of the month. But we are told that the term cannot supply us: look thin that. The blankets we were given, having exchanged the old ones. They are not of the good quality. Cde Kheya is not in position to give us a new tent, because according to him, we are free to build the shelter ourselves (do not want to build them): we can see what to do. We are also requesting permission to travel to Dehlwe residence, so that we keep our meat and other foods for a long time without being spoiled. TRANSPORT 1. disorganised; or taking the Logistics in Dehlwe in effect. We, once more, request Hheinbu to provide us with a truck for the smooth running of our work. U signed:

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SYSTEM OF WORK sLOGISTICS - DAKAVAI.

The system of work between the Logistics of Mazinbu and Dakawa is basically controlled from Mazinbu. The Chief Logistics is expected to submit the numbers of people from each residence. His requisitions have to be given in advance, so that the people of the Logistics in Mazinbu could be in a position to make a follow up on time. That is meant to facilitate the program of the truck which is due to come to Dakawa 3 times a week and on Thursdays it comes occasionally either for charcoal or paraffin or any other consignment.

Essentially the truck has to be accompanied by a member of the Logistics from Dakawa for assurance of every consignment in the truck. In case of any complications in Mazinbu for the Dakawa Chief logistics, he has to consult with Cde. Khaya in the Treasury. So far the problem of supply has been solved partially and for any co-operation to be reached the Dakar Logistics has to submit its report on the last consignment they received. Either than that there would be no case from Dakawa considered by Mazinbu. Cde. Tando the petty cashier will continue to facilitate the milk and paying for it. A LOGISTICS DEPARTMENT REPORT

A STRIANIOUS functionary system was encountered by our department of 105istics throughout the menth of June 1985. This was brought about by the sudden strategy that happed on the 2nd of June 1985 When our truck turned over.

As a result our duty could not function efficient until Mazimbu rescued our situation by supplying our needs with their tran8port, and these service goes onli as far as delivering and then we use hanomag van for our internal distribution around the complex.

This process attempted to maintain communition across the department and its sections. Our department then call for aux consultative meeting of the committe. The meeting was convened at VTC from 10 am on July 2nd with all the representatives of the defferent residences present. On the agenda the secretary reads the minuted of the meeting that was last held by the committe with comrage Khaya from treasury being present. The aim of the meeting was to reflect the problems faced by our department and its committe according to the situation that lacks us efficiency and co-operatinn for effective co-ordinatj on in our functions. Well the whole process in the exchange of views and suggetions was perceptible for everyone in the meeting, even though comrade Khaya indicated his concern and attension, made his promise withh empty hands but emphasised his consideration of our situationo

We then turned over to review our structure and deligate the representatives with extended tasks so as to relief the chief losistic from having all his duties cencertrate. 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Answering Cde Maseko said though there was no report inconneoiion with that study tour, the whole idea was still part and p-roel of the Nutritional seminar which was held in Mazimbu.

Cde Evelyn then said the Committee which was to be elected should be consist of personnel from treasury, Medical team, agriculture and Catering.

At that stage Cde Maseko suggested that before election the participants should first state the functions of the said committee. The house agreed with Cde Maseko.

Cde Evelyn suggested that the first function should be:-

(a) To look into the nutritional level of the community including both adults and children. She continued to say that on several occasions especially in Mazimbu there was a tendency of neglecting the adults when it came to supply of certain commodities. She went on to say even Mr Semiti had said that he had noticed some mild malnutrition amongst adults within Mazimbu during his evaluation study.

Answering Cde Khaya said the negligence on the question of adults was not deliberate, it was because the first pregence always went to children especially when there was a shortage of some certain commodities. He went on to say it also depended on the budget at that particular moment. Cde Evelyn said that the cut off of imporb tant commodities was usually too long as a result there were many cases of T.b. and other diseases caused by the lack of certain commodities. Cde Khaya said as he had pointed out that that was not deliberate the other reason was that the faxm.was not producing enough. He went on to say that in his department they had been trying to get some milk and the producers of milk could not supply sufficient amount of milk that was required within Mazimbu. He said they had managed to get eggs in bult and he said he; was hoping that it would continue that way. He went on to say that t the nutritional committe should advise the treasury as well as the supply aooording to the needs of the community. He said he had gone to the Market in Morogoro on several occasions he had not seen things like spinaroh, letis and so on. He said the producers sins ply sold what they had.

Cde Maseko said the buying of fruits and vegetable at present was not economical. He said formerly the people who used to do purh chasing used to go to the maountains whenever there was any trans-port avaiable. and they would get some vegetable and fruits at a cheaper price than in Morogoro Market.

Cde Maseko said he would rather suggest that instead of the organisation to ask for funds from CIDA he would prefer thp?,asked for commodities that was not available in Tanzania. He said the work of the Nutritional Committee should also to work hand in had with such organisations and deal directly with them id possible not through Lusaka.

Ode Sandile said the Committee should first look into what commodities were available in Mazimbu and also with the help of the agridulture, things that could be produced in the farm before making a request of any commodities from the donors. He continued to say that the f Committee should see t9 it that the farm is revived. Vegetables and fruits that could be of importance in the diet should be grown.

Ode malums answering said it is true that we did get some funds from CIDA. But CIDA was not the only organisation that was donating there were many others. He said though he did not see the reason why we did not produce our own vegetables and fruits from the farm. He said our people were lazy, they did not want to work. He further said that even we could rear a lot of cattle to produce milk enough to feed the community. He said even eggs for that matter he did not see why the community whould stay without them.

After the election of the committee there was a question of whom was the Committee going to be answerable. He said in some residents in Dakawa where one would find that all the people living there were students and did not have time to prepare their food properly. The preparation of good food was almost nil. He said whilst the committee was carrying on its duties on nutrition he would also recommend and appeal to them to look into the problems in Dakawa in particular.

Cde Malume answering said arrangement of storage were on the way and he said they were also thinking of getting a generator for Dakawa.

Cde Maseko said he would recommend that the personnel in the kitchens be trained so that they should be able to prepare good food. He said most kitchens the food is badly prepared. He continued to say that in the nutrition seminar a suggestion had been made that the personnel in the kitchen be trained on crush programmes.

Answering Cde Natso said arrangement were on the way to organise courses for the kitchen staff. She said not only for Mazimbu but for Dakawa and Darkes-Slaam respectively.

The meeting was declared closed at 11.30 a.m.
