RE: BUDGET ITEM NO: 5 (FILM DESK/VIDEO UNIT) OF 1989 ANC CULTURAL ALLOCATION

Firstly we would like to make some general observations. At the ANC/NORWEGIAN talks held in Oslo around the end of October 1989, we submitted a budgetary report, a written report on DAC cultural activities funded by Norway and and Budget Proposal for 1990. The only response we had was to say that we had to cut our 1990 budget from NOK 1m to 800,000. We promptly did that and handed it in via the Office of the Treasurer-General. From that date we have never had any response - either to confirm agreement of our amended proposal or whether our financial report corresponded with yours nor responses to questions concerning expenditures. It was difficult working out our final statement as purchases had been made in different regions and we were never informed of the exact amounts. Other than Lusaka, where we are aware of final costs, the only region to inform us of expenditures was Harare. Consequently we were eager for such information prior to the end of the financial year so we could know what was still outstanding and disperse it accordingly.

Moreover when we came to the new year and wanted to disburse funds according to our proposal we presumed that silence meant acquiesence and went ahead only to find that none of the NPA regional offices had our budget and knew nothing of this year's disbursement plan. This has been remedied by our sending the budget to Lusaka, Harare and Dar Es Salaam and authorisation being obtained through the Projects Dept and our Chief Rep in Norway.

We give this background because we are concerned that our request to hold over funds for the Cultural Film of above budget item may not have been heeded. We enclose copy of excerpts from our reports pertaining to this issue. We are presuming that the funds are still there for use but would like confirmation of this.

Further to this we are requesting a re-allocation of these funds. As you are well aware the unbanning of the ANC has led to considerable re-thinking and re-organising! Our Video Unit and Dynamic Images, the partners in South Africa, have both been selected to accompany Cde Mandela on his frequent tours. In fact dynamic Images was requested by the MDM to cover the releases of the imprisoned leadership and that of Cde Mandela himself. With these pressures on them it has been impossible for them to advance on the film. This week we are sending a cultural delegation inside South Africa for extensive consultations. We have already approached FAWU (Film and Allied Workers Union) about taking on this project as part of their training programme, which they are keen on doing. We attach a briefing on the Education Committee to give you an idea of their aims and programme. Given there is funding they will take over from Dynamic Images and bring in trainees for on-the-job experience. FAWU is made up of the best of our skilled and trained Film people in the country and we have no doubt of the final quality of the video, whilst offering development. We, of course, need further discussions on this matter with FAWU which are planned during our visit. We will then be in a better position to give you concrete arrangments and banking details.

In discussions so far they have intimated that the full \$ 28,000 will not be needed. \$ 20,000 will suffice. We therefore further request that the remaining \$ 8000 be given to the newly elected Interim National Cultural Desk for the on-going work for the next 4 months leading to the Launch of A National Cultural Workers Congress. A national consultation of cultural workers was held at the end of May 1990 and this interim structure was elected with the mandate to work on the ground and make preparations for the launch. This requires a full time person in each of the 6 regions to consult as broadly as possible with all democratic cultural groups and funds for the committee to meet. They are having to raise funds for the Launch due in September, but have a crises on their hands in that they have no immediate funds to start their work. We have promised to help as we believe this work is absolute priority, which if effective will lead to the formation of a truly representative National Cultural Workers Congress.

We await a response in principle for us to go ahead as requested and would be grateful if you could inform us in time for us to discuss the matter with the concerned bodies whilst visiting South Africa, so that we can forward a budget proposal. We have also asked Dynamic Images to prepare a statement of accounts and report of the work done to date, which we will submit. Your response can be directed to CDe Tikly, who will be able to get hold of us. Many thanks.

WORKShop. Chanded in at ANC INDRINEGIAN talks Oct/Nov 1989)

The film on Culture in South Africa, following developments since CASA, including CASA footage, is in the process and the remaining funds will have to be held over to early 1990 to see its completion. At the moment USD 22,000 has been paid for research and filming inside South Africa and the film will be jointly edited in Lusaka with the ANC video unit, which falls under the control of DAC and DIP.

Committee Reports

• Education Committee

THE Education Committee has undergone a process of restructuring during the first part of the year. There are now four sub-committees that make up the full Education Committee.

The community video education sub-committee is responsible for the running of the part-time video courses in Alex and for setting up the full-time film and video education centre.

The feature film training sub-committee will assist in the development of a training project called

'South Stories' which will aim at producing a feature film using four South African short stories. People working on the project will receive training in feature film production. This project is still in the early stages of development.

The trainee sub-committee is responsible for the development of the trainee scheme whereby people are placed on productions for on-the-job training in technical skills. Last year five trainees were involved in the production of 'Operation Weissdorn'.

The education screenings subcommittee is responsible for screening lms around particular themes, histories or contexts. Last year a 12week series on independent South African documentary from the 70s till the present was screened.

The sub-committee hopes to screen a series of documentaries on the Vietnam War Ihis year depending on the availability of films. The aim is to see how the Vietnam War was represented from a number of perspectives. For example, from the point of view of the US government supporting the war or from the perspectives of independent US filmmakers critical of the war or from Cuban, British, French or North Vietnamese points of view.

An additional aim of the screenings sub-committee is to place each series in a suitcase with educational notes for discussion and to make these 'video suitcases' more widely available.





The sub-committee is being helped by a group of Khanya College students who have been seconded to FAVO to do an organisationally-linked project as part of their curriculum. They will be working as education, distribution fieldworkers organisting video screenings in communities following a process of consultation with community structures.

• Information & Research

NOR Powell, elected chair of Info & Research, has decided to step down from his seat. His schedule has become too tight and there are imminent twins. He will, however, continue to contribute towards our newsletter. Mickey Dube, vice-chair, will now assume lvor's seat. Marabane is to be vice-chair.

Info & Research is now composed of three sub-comms: Broadcasting, Film and Newsletter sub-comms. More volunteers are, however, still sought for the Newsletter group, whose main function would be to collect and edit material. Production is done by TOPS.

Mickey Dube co-ordinates the Broadcasting sub-comm, and Marabane the Film sub-comm. There is as yet no co-ordinator for the newsletter sub-comm.

Info & Research is to begin an information agency, to be run 'professionally'. If you have articles, newspaper cuttings, delicate information etc that you deem significant to be in our possession, drop it off at the FAWO office. Later in the year, depending on whether or not the FAWO Centre will be fully functioning, we hope to run a resource centre.


