Dr Mdlalose said he and the deputy secretary general of the ANC, Mr Jacob Zuma, had for more than a year been engaged in attempts to bring about peace in Natal.

Mr Zuma was to have addressed the briefing yesterday as well, but because of delays in Johannesburg arrived at the venue just as Dr Mdlalose was leaving to attend a KwaZulu Legislative Assembly caucus meeting.

Dr Mdlalose said: \hat{a} 200\234No doubt we have not achieved much success. Violence still goes on as all of you know. \hat{a} 200\235

But their attempts had not been completely in vain, Dr Mdlalose said. Their efforts had brought some control in Umgababa, violence had diminished in Ndwedwe, and reconstruction work had begun in

Mpumalanga where the local ANC, IFP and business community had been roped in.

. sus. The meeting was adjourned until December $4.a\200\235$

Dr Mdlalose said Mr Zuma $a\200\234$ only arrived when we were taking up our papers $a\200\235$ $a\200\224$ two-and-a-half hours after the meeting had started.

Dr Mdlalose said Mr Willis Mchunu from the ANC'â\200\231s northern Natal region could â\200\234hardly make an impactâ\200\235 in terms of reaching consensus on issues.

Applauded

The ANC had arrived with a list of other political groups they thought were relevant in the Natal region who should be brought onto the committee. The IFP applauded the list but wanted to add a few organisations as well. It was $\frac{3}{200}$ then the dispute started coming up $\frac{3}{200}$ Dr Mdlalose said.

He hoped the differences could be resolved to allow the regional and local committees to be set up.

Of the commission of inquiry into the Thokoza massacre under Advocate Masakazi Sithole, Dr Mdlalose said there was a need for IFP witnesses to prepare affidavits. This required the help of advocates and attorneys, which cost money the IFP did not have. This meant IFP witnesses would fail to testify, Dr Mdlalose said.

National Congress (ANC) and its one-time rival for the leadership of the South African liberation struggle, the Pan-Africanist Congress (PAC), yesterday marked the build-up to multi-party talks which are tomorrow expected to set the scene for negotlations on the country's constitutional future.

The PAC, which is looking increasingly divided in its approach to the talks, yestorday claimed to have evidence showing that the ANC and the government had reached a sccrot agreement on the framework for a constitutional settlement,

The organisation said the ANC's fotelgn affairs spokes-man, Thabo Mbeki, had disclosed in a briefing to Frontline ambassadors at the United Nations that agreement had been reached with the administration of President F. W. de Klerk for the introduction of an interim government in February.

In return, the ANC had allegedly agreed to abandon its key deomand for the creation of an clected constituent assembly to decide on a new constitution.

The ANC last night described the allegations as $\hat{a}\200\234$ unfounded $\hat{a}\200\235$. its socretary general Cyril Ramaphosa said: $\hat{a}\200\234$ The ANC

wishes to state ecategorically that since the suspension of constitutional talks with the {ruling} National Party in April

1991, the ANC has entered into no discussions with either the National Party, or the South African government regarding the interlm adininistration, the proposed Referendum Bill or the constituent assembly.â\200\235

The government's constitutional supremo, Dr Gerrit Viljoen, backed the ANC in its denials, saying no agreement had been reached with the liberation movement on any constitutional issues. â\200\234The government's negotiations with the ANC have so far centred on the negotiation process and security problems.â\200\235 L

The PAC has been bitterly divided over whother to particlpate in the negotiating process, .,

Political commentators suspect there is an clement of truth in the PACâ\200\231s allegations, but it fs assumed that the $a\200\234$ understandingâ\200\235 is based more on a shared perception of the direction which the negotlatlons are likely to take, rather than a formal agreement.

More than 20 political organisations are expected to meet tomorrow at a hotel outside Jan Smuts international airport, near Johannesburg, to discuss the hasis of future talks.

The government will, proba. bly be represented separately from the ruling National Party.—All 10 of the homelands are expected to participate.

The only major. political groups expected to boycott the proceedings are three right-wing oxtremist organisations and the black consclousness movement, the Azanian People's Organisation.
