- 1.1. The chairman welcomes cde. Sam Nkwe who sits on the NSC-meetings to represent the Youth's section.
- 1.2.1. Cde. Hazel reported back on her counselling of certain applicants.
- 1.2.2. Ndileka Dalindyabo and Sibongile Tembo would enroll for the Secretarial Training Course which was due to take place in Mazimbu next year.
- 1.2.3. Concern was voiced regarding the Secretarial Course that it might be for upgrading those already experienced.
- 1.3. Unanimously agreed that the Deputy Chief Rep. in Berlin, Nelson Miys would be informed that there would be no candidates for the ten (10) places (textile machined mechanics and mine-drilling) therefore he should ask for untied offers.
- 2.1. Report/DMD
  - 2.1.1. The chairman reported back on the meeting (nov 24, 1983) with the Director of DMD cde. Andrew Masondo. Members of the administrative staff of the DMD were:
    - i. the Director - Cde. Andres Masondo (at HQ)
    - ii. the Deputy Director - Cde. Mark Shope (at HQ)
    - iii. the Administrative Secretary Cde. Sam Masemola (at HQ)
    - iv. the DMD Rep. in Mazimbu - cde. Enos Ngutshana
  - 2.1.2. The director reported that a memo for the registration of qualified personnel had been submitted to the ECC subcommittee for final consideration.
  - 2.1.3. The DMD Rep. in East-Africa/Mazimbu's responsibility would be:
    - i. to attend meetings of the NSC
    - ii. to report to the DMD about relevant issues emanating from the NSC
    - iii. interview and arrange temporary deployment of returned qualified students
    - iv. to follow up discussion with the NSC
    - v. to coordinate work with the Regional Commissariat

- 2.1.4. The director said that
- the DMD would provide the NSC with a list of priorities
  - the NSC should not be pressured by offers b t by needs
  - arrangements for deploying qualified students were underway with the Governments of Angola, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Lesotho and Botswana.
- 2.1.5. The placement of students in Frontline States was encouraged.
- 2.1.6. The DMD requested that the NSC should categorise returned qualified students according to fields of study.
- 2.1.7. Agreed that Party School applications was the responsibility of the Commissariat and the SG's Office
- 2.2.1. It was agreed that cdes. Mamatho and Enos should work out a list of needs of the Movement in Mazimbu/Dakawa (East-Afr.)
- 2.2.2. It was suggested and agreed that the SOMAFCO Career Guidance Committee be consulted regarding placement of students.

- ii. Dikgang Nene to be placed in Bulgaria. reason: to keep couples together (see minutes of Oct. 19, para 4.1.ii)
- iii. Virginia Motapanyane to be interviewed about place of study and supervisor.
- iv. Mampati Motseoane - provisionally placed in Tanzania; to plead with authorities in the USSR to accept him since he has reformed.
- v. Nomsa Msimango - to be seen by Cde. Dennis
- vi. Cynthia Letshabo - not decided yet about Catering and she would be counselled.

- vii. Mbombo Mbewe - does not like dressmaking but secretarial training. She is likely to go to Zambia.
- viii. Zamdile Ngakane - provisionally placed in the USSR. To ask the Secretary for Education about her 'A'level exams.
