ISRAELI POLICE KILL PALESTINIANS

One woman and 29 palestinians were wounded when Israeli army opened fire on protesters. Palestinian youth fought back, setting up road blocks, burning tires and engaging the Israeli army in street battles.

The civil war in Somalia has claimed 14,000 lives in Somalia in the past four months. Five million people are threatened with starvation due to the strife and the pread of drought.

SWAZILAND

The Government of Swaziland has launched a national development programme to attract foreign investors. The African Development Bank has provided a loan of \$20 million for this purpose.
