A number of boxes of books and teaching aids were sent with cde Tikly's personal luggage. London has assured him that they have long arrived in Dar, but cde Sipho Ngcobo searched through his documents when I last saw him and could not find anything. Could you please check with Tikly and Sipho about this consignment.

As you are the only person authorised to have any dealing with the docks and the airport, it follows that you are the only person who can inform us about our consignments. Please let me know if you are not in a position to do this.
