4 Actigng

4.1 Staffigg: We need firstly to find the staff, ensuring 'that the teachers are the right kind of teachers for this school, as well as ensuring that their credentials are acceptable to the TED.

Teachers need to have language competencies to handle students who have difficulties with English, and be able to bridge students into English so that they can gain access to other inner city schools.

ACTION: Lottie agreed to confirm the situation with regard to continuity with pension funds and other benefits for these teachers who have previously been 3t) employed by other government education departments. It is important to establish and maintain personal contact with the education department officials.

Though it is possible that the school will extend to become a senior primary school in the future, at this stage we will select teachers who have particular skills in junior primary teaching.
