1.0 Minutes were read and and adopted after one correction.

1.2 The meetilng noted that volunteer teacher Elsa is now moved to another class. She started well,hopeful that! she will progress.

1.3 Comrade I-Izumbe is not yet interviewed about becoming a . permanent boarding master. He is presently in Dar es Salaam.

1.4 Comrade Director has called meeting with logistics and supplies department, now awaiting COMrade Khaya's response.

1.5 Noted that the DCC is presently well staffed, but Will submit long term staffing list. I

1.6 The meeting was informed of Comrade Mmabatho's visit and the arrival of Comrade Barbara Maseksla.

2.0 Adult Education basic and intermediate.

2.1 Comrade Tweed presented a comprehensive 24 page report, covering the period between November 1984 and February 1985. 1

2.2 He reported the need for enrolment of 3 more teachers. This provoked discussion on justification of such recruitment. The meeting finally resolved that Adult Education teachers should not be full time. The Department should enlist the assistance of teachers with light workload from other sectors. Guidelines to be drawn for the implementation of this resolution.

2.3 Also reported were shortages of text books. Comrade Tweed was advised to check the book series available at the Resources Department, and make order accordingly. -'

2.4 The meeting noted that a paper on Adult Education by Comrade Babu was distributed but there was no response from committee members.

Secondary School:

3.1 Principal Maseko reported a series of burglaries at the girls dormitories and teachers residence. The Project Manager is not responding, the matter to be taken up at the Directorate.

3.2 There is a serious shortage of chairs in Unit 7 and 3.

' This inconvenience the student meals. An appeal to be made to relevant departments.

. 3.3 He requested the Education Committee to look into the establishment of a maintenance department.

3.4 The question of the urgency of the sports fields was again raised. 30 is the pregnancy cases, two more cases were reported. .

3.5 A case of stabbing was reported, when this happened there was no transport. The school is badly in need of transport.

3.6J Comrade Maseko is coordinator of UFESCO Seminar to be held from 9321'3 April 19 35. Four participants from the Inspectorate, Ministry of Education will be present.

3. 7 Also reported was the FAO seminar, held in Mazimbu on 27, 28 February and 1st March 1985, where the urgency for setting up a coordination committee to look into variety and distribution of food was emphasised.

4.0 Primarx Schggli

4.1 The Principal reported that young Themba Sabi needs
' Psychiatric treatments.

4.2 Two students Pule and Tiro Motshabi have not yet-returned
to school since visiting their father in Zambia.

4.3 One teacher, former form 5 SOMAFCO student, has left the
school and the Principal was required to take over the
abandoned class. He made a strong recommendation that
serious effort be made to recruit capable teachers.

4.4 Teacher Henry Mali has submitted a letter of transfer
from the school. The school supports this move, the
Comrade needs help, he drinks too much. .

4.5 He appealed for consultation regarding housing of the
Primary School teachers.

4.6 The Primary School was not supplied With water during
crisis. Children had to move around with containers
looking for water. Comrade chairman informed the meeting
that within 2 weeks the complex Will get supply of
water from Morogoro town. Charcoal is supplied for big
kitchens for emergency. The questions of overcrowding
in class rooms, insecurity of classrooms, shortages of
clothing and shoes are still outstanding.

4.7 The meeting decided that the PTA for Primary and
Secondary School should be set up.

4.8 The supply of food has increased in quantity and quality%
He expressed gratitude to the catering staff.

5.0 Egggyx Schgg;

5.1 She reported the need to Visit other Nursery Schools
around Morogoro and Dar es Salaam. Transport is still
a stumbling block to this regard.

5.2 The school is also in dire need for a telephone.
Unfortunately this cannot be installed because of lack
telephone receivers.

5.3 Comrade Rachidi Who replaced comrade Don is arrogant, and
problematic.

5.4 All visitors to the Nursery School should come With a
letter or memo from the Director.

5.5 The children have undergone medical check up. The meeting
decided that this should be done more regularly. Comrade
Director to take up the matter with WHO, UHISEF and
Embassies.
