



Re: Housing Committee.

I had a chat with Comrade Enos on Monday, 5th September and suggested to him that Comrade Jimmy should represent the school on the housing committee. He should not only be concerned with the student accomodation. Comrade Enos had no objection to this suggestion.

The Luanda Youth Kitchen

Ntombikayise saw me today and she was in a rattled state with regard to the housing re-arrangements she had effected at Luanda. As you know the old school kitchen in Luanda has just been given to the working youth to use since their removal from Ilala. They have been given:-

- The diningroom
- The cooking place
- and outside store-room.

Luanda Residence ( 6 rooms is all)


- 2 x rooms: Silk-screen workshops
- 1 x small room: Occupied by Ma-Malithaba, Comrade Mjiba. She has three (3) children and the place is rather to small.
- 1 x store-room: This is a much bigger room which up to now is being used by the school kitchen for storage. Ntombikayise had exchanged it for Ma-Mjiba's room.

From what Ntombikayise says Comrade Enos somehow 'rudely' asked Ma-Mjiba to move out as he is the only person responsible for housing. It would appear that a tiff developed between Ntombikayise and Enos. The way I see it Ntombikayise was right in offering Ma-Mjiba a bigger room which is used by the school.

- 1 x bigger room: Used by Belina and a daughter. Belina is no longer under the school.
- 1 x tuck-shop.

Now the question of the school kitchen staff(from Lesotho) has not been given serious thought and this is a grave political ommission in view of their background. Presently, some of them are in Unit 1, block 3. I must point out that they be obtained better accomodation elsewhere.

Lastly, I strongly suggest that Ma-Mjiba be allowed to stay in the bigger room because she has three (3) children.
