Once we understand this, it will become clear that this so called worker summit is nothing but their own cometogether or drinking party aimed at getting workers in drunk and witnesses to the adoption of the some unknown programmes, or policies long arrived at by thetwo Cosatu and Nactu leadership and their liberal bourgeois partners. ## NACTU SUMMITEERS

Comrades, the recent Nactu National Council resolution withdrawing from attending the sham "WORKERS SUMMIT" is significant in that it checked bureacratic tendencies developing in Nactu as well as exposed the Cosatu leadership's pretentious at Worker Summit aimed at pursuing their hidden agenda under the cover of publicly displayed one. We have already exposed the fact that the labour Relations Amendment Act and state repressions issues have been included in the, agenda in order to divert the attention of trade Unions, federations and workers away from the real agenda, "Building Uhity" which constitute the essence and the reason of this socalled Worker Summit. This should have read "Building Cosatu Unity" in Cosatu Workers Summit. This is how important the Nactu National Council resolution is, over an above, it was a democratically arrived at resolution.

Cosatu leadership, the self-styled custodians of the principle of unity and the liberal big bourgeois christined, representatives of the majority, in reacting to this democratic resolution of Nactu, exposed their real intentions. Didn't they call upon Nactu affilliates to undermine their own resolution and come to the summit? Such a call isn's it tantamount to calling for Nactu disunity? How can we reconcile such a call to Nactu affilliates with a leadership which has appealed for "Building Unity"?

Thrthe Nactu affilliates who are signatories hp the document on thd'worker Summit. Our position Statement, we can only refer them to some of their qouted principles. That their position is not only regretable, wrong, and undemocratic, but has the effect of irreparably destrtyihj unity within Nactu and rendering talk such as "Maximum Unity of the Black Working Class"-childish . a

These Nactu Summiteers, in pursuance of their quest for the maximum unity of the Black working class fail to inform themselves that, in this quest, they have decided to reject an important organisational principle of democratic centralism meaning that the majority will subject itself to the resolutions of the majority, that since Nactu is a federation, all democratic decisions taken by Nactu will be binding on all its affilliates, This part of the above qouted principle should suffice to clarify the summiteers. This is not the only principle the summiteer appear to be F.u;g ngr are violating, in their quest for their Black Working biass nity, they also violated the principle of worker central.

Is it not true that the Nactu National Council is composed of affilliates delegates, most of whom are workers from the factory floor and the workers and interlectuals have jniht' tha.workig; cl :s in a full-time or permanent position and are now called union officials. Defying this resolution, is it not tantamount to the rejection of this principle? While we who have the quest for maximum unity, we who owe total allegiance and are fully committed to Nactu, we whose posltion is in pursuant to the interest of the large Working class struggles should also remember that all these proclamations become on empty talk or mere phrase mongering if they are not supported by principled deeds. How do we hope to -attain this broader unity if we talk about Black Working class and Cosatu talks about multiracial working class. The correct position here is not to go to a drinking party, to shout at each other once we are drunk, but to realize that we 5. have differences and to identify issue that unite us, these issues are not theoretical but are praCtical for they are. issue that affect the daily lives of the working class. Hence, the correct position is to acknowledge that working class organisations is not only Cosatu and Nactu and that we should start from t e fa t at h ' then explore a unity t at s al acgohoadgetedltgiiiesredlic eaxpeq'xce but emphasis on what is pressing, and common to most. That is struggles for now, the Labour Relations Amendment  $\operatorname{Act}$  is the issue. The forum, we maintain is the Trade Union United Front Conference and not a summit or Anti- Apartheid Conference and not a summit or Anti- Apartheid Conference. Such a forum, could not have caused a split in Nactu, such a forum would have been open to all unions, would not have called upon Nactu affilliates to defy it and still nmintain a broad smile proclaiming, unity. The summiteers have to take into conderation that their difference in Nactu are not of the magnatude deserving to split Nactu and have to be suspicious of anybody who encourages splits on the one hand and unity on the other. We believe that a trade union United Front Conference becomes more fruitful with the participation of properly constituted and united trade unions. All the same the Summieers still have to subject themselves to the same principles even at this so-called summit. We do realize, that Nactu is presently having problems along ideological lines, and we appeal to the Nactu comrades to ensure that they resolve their internal contradictions and never allow any opportunist to take advantage of them. The summiteers must take their position to Nactu Congress, beggining with opening it up at factory floor and in all their structures and let it conted with other positions, but must be prepared to take defeat and not to opt for a

short cut, but abide by democratic decision wrong or right

is the will of the majority.

To conclude, unity is a sacred principle of the workers and it can never be hushed up, it is voluntary and no one can be coerced into it, hence, we believe there was nothing wrong with Nactu, realizing that it has division in its midst to request for a postponement in order to can attend to its problems. We agree with its position even though, we are opposed to this so-called worker summit and believe that in the long run most Worker Leaders and workers themselves will come to learn in the process of summerizing experience and once they have learned will conclude, that a trade Union United Front Conference is the correct position.

.The united front principle is a weapon that unifies all democratic forces and classes against the enemies of the In order to function as a unifying principle it needs to be wielded by the class that survives on unity, i.e the working class.

But the South African working class is itself divided along historical lines i.e. along nationalist lines. This is born out by the existence of the two federations, Nactu and Cosatu, themselves divided along national sectarian lines.

In order to lead others in unity, the working class itself needs to be united. But it cannot be united in utopian fashion without paying attention to the realities i.e. without recognising the organisational ideological and factional differences within it, differences, it is true, which are a legacy of past nationalist leadership but differences which nonetheless are there

In such a situation, in the situation where the democratic mass movement remains week because of nationalist divisions, where the working class has to play the unifying role within the mass democratic movement but where the working class itself is burdened with the same nationalist sectarianism and divisions, the only correct starting point is with the unity of the working class and on that basis to proceed to the unity of the entire democratic mass movement led by a unitedy working class. Therefore the only principled stand is and has been that there is a need for the Trade Union united front conference. This shall enable the working class organisations to work out principles of the united front which shall be carried into the entire democratic

mass movement in order to unite the democratie eeee . eoveeent in present and future struggles. \_ The united front of the working class organisations shall have to be done on the basis of democratic mandates and consultations. It shall have to cast aside the bi federation chauvinism and seek to unite with whych ever democratic Trade union that is interested in eilitant unity egainst the Racist minority Regine end the bosses.

One could have thought that the above was quite clear and needed no further explanation. That all serious minded leaders of the working class would work along these lines and avoid opportunism.

But this has proved to be too much to the Cosetu/Neetu leadership. - These people could not think clearly about what the working class is capable of or what it should be doing. Instead they were too busy thinking what THEY and the SACCOLLA' bourgeosie could do together without the workers and egeinst their interests and those of the entire democratic mass movement. They were too busy paving the way to eapituietion instead of thinking how to fight.

These capitulationist gentry too talked of "unity". They even talked of "united front". The sorry picture is as follows. .

Previously and ever since the formation of Cosatu and later Nactu. there has reigned nationalist factionelism and deep going sectarianism within the Trade Union federations. The position of principle, thanks to nationalist tradition, has been division and not unity. with the introduction of the Labour Relations Amendment Bill, the workers throughout the country were awakened to the need for unity of the working class ranks. The Cosatu special Congress of 1988 had this as the background. The major ty of the delegates demanded unity and the united front.

On the question of the united front, matters stood like

1. There was the anti-united front position of the hardline nationalists who based themselves on the socelled 'Cosetu Political Policy" which says unite only with those who endorse the Freedom Charter and are of the ANc-SACP Congress alliance. with this monument of division within the working class these gentry fought against the united front position. They fought it knowing fully well what it entailed. 2. There were the opportunist: of the Trotskyite and Social Democratic type. These gentry had done well . in the organisation of FOSATU where they earned themselves the label 'workerists' because of their detailed Trade Unionise.

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Politically, however, the had never held lny position of principle. T ey had , been eeeily shouldered out of the Coeatu top leadership etekee which had fallen into the hands of the nationalists with their political edventurism. rhetoric and high Iedie profile. The opportunist: had sparked off as non poiiticais but under pressure of the democratic mesa movements. the increasing revolunazetion of the situation as a whole and in competition with the nationalist leadership for the hi h pieces, the opportunists also wanted to show ghat the too were political. No. they were not Just mere y the fools under the influence of international social democracy a' le'

ICFTU etc but yes, they could be political if they wanted to.  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{t}}$ 

It is these entry that came up with the notion of the non-c ess united front. It is they that rushed to kiss and make amengs with the nationalists on a compromise resolution. The compromise resolution endorsed the sectarian "Cosatu Political Policy" but proceeded to call for "brotdening" unity on the basis of the UDF Cosetu alliance. What happened thereafter followed Exactly that pattern, the pattern of seeking to "unife" with N. others on the basis of the UDF-Cosatu e liance. - That is to say, the nationalist Congress aliance recognising itself as a centre around which "all" could "unite".

The sectarian nationalist position and the opportunist non-class unity had merged. what is more it is led by the hardened sectarianism of the Congress alliance - not the working class! The correct united front position was defeated as early as the above. Previously, it could be said that the opprtunists formed the same block with the united front position, the were allies. But the opportunist; were quick to deser that alliance at the slightest flattery end Joined in alliance with the nationalists. Effectively end as regards the opportunists this meant that they could never again oppose the nationalist leadership based on principle. They could henceforth only restrict themselves to objection egaist detaile' or excesses done by the nationalists. On principle, they had become one!

what follwed was the consistent application of the nationalist/oppartunist line. It has followed the following trail.

This circus was to bring together elements from Cosatu, Nectu, UDF, Azapo Bantustan party oppposition leaders. captains from among the big bourgeosie including liberal big bourgeois organisations and parties such as IDASA NON etc. It was to include the shebeen, reformist sports bodies. Indeed many people were left asking: why did they leave out Inkathe end Buthelezi?

The UDF-Cosatu leadership had reall -come-out in their-best elements-assif-to-esi "what Is wrong when we the seal! Bourgeosie meet with the big bourgeoisie' You did all that in the name of the workers. would be the proper retort! The opportunists who had long ago erased any differences of principle with nationalist caoituletion were con-.cerned only with the details. They did not approve of the embarrassment of being under one roof with Bentusten party officials - they even murmurred objections against the bosses who were to attend the circus. Apparently with the bosses around they would not be able to enjoy themselves well! Nonetheless, like a prostitute who cannot help herself out of temptation, the opportunists despite their objections prepared to attend thexcircus even after a section of then had slammed it as a "betrayal"! Those workers end-leaders-of-rinci le, decided that Cosafu Ieaaershp a gone an ar an they decided to rebel. They supported the "Protest Note" which was then in circulation.

The 'Protest Note" explained that Cosatu leadership had long forsaken the working class and mass democratic struggles and were preparing subjective grounds to enter into open partnership with the liberal big bourgeoisie with a hope of appeasing the racist regiue and engaging in negotiations based on racist reforms. To this day it has never been rebuffed, to this day it is true:

The Azacco realised that their organisation was at the receiving end of congress nationalist chauvinism and was going to be involved in a grand circus of betrayal. It issued an open letter announcing its withdrawal. The Nectu prepared to do the same. The trickle was becoming a stampede.

Only COsatu-UDF gentlemen and their Bentustan, Tri-ceoerel and big bourgeois guests were preparing to attend the circus. The opportunists too. when the racist banned the circus, this did not change its political status - actually. it aeved the organisers political face: It has already been pxpoaad.1

It is said that the "summit" idea came from Nectu and was accepted by Cosatu C.E.C. That is neither here nor there.

at importance is to what extent the nationalist leaders and opportunists particularly those in the congress movement can go in an attempt to demoralise the working class without political will, so as to enable nationalism particularly the Congress alliance nationalists to pursue their capituletionist tactics, all in the name of a wretched, demoralised and apolotical working class! It is of no importance as to who introduced the idea of the "summit", of importance is that the "summit" idea is the continuation of the "A.A.G." by another route!

At least in Cosatu, it is the crowning of the

bureaucratic style of work, of commandism and of meking short work with worker democracy:
To proceed with the so-celled "summit" on the present basis is naked opportunism. THE FIVE ACCUSED ARE MOSES MAYEKISO, PAUL TSHABALALA, RICHARD NDAKANE, OBED BAPELA AND MZHANELE MAYEKISO.

THE FIVE ACCUSED HAVE BEEN IN CUSTODY FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS TRIAL FOR THE FOLLOHING PERIOD:-

- 1. MOSES HAYEKISO SINCE 28 JUNE 1986 AFTER HE HAS ARRESTED IN R10 000,00 TERMS OF \$29 OF THE INTERNAL SECURITY ACT AT JAN SMUTS AIRPORT.
- 2. PAUL TSHABALALA SINCE 22 JANUARY 1987 AFTER HE HAS ARRESTED R 5 000,00 1N TERMS OF 550 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ACT 1N ALEXANDRA.
- 3. RICHARD HDAKANE SINCE 21 JUNE 1986 AFTER HE HAS ARRESTED IN R 5 000,00 TERMS OR REGULATIONS 3 OF THE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS IN ALEXANDRA.
- A. USED BAPELA SINCE 10 JUNE 1986 AFTER HE HAS ARRESTED IN R 5 000,00 TERMS OF 529 OF THE INIERNAL SECURITY ACT.

AT THE NEXT PDSTPONEMENT OF THE CASE IN FEBRUARY 1987, THE PROSECUTOR INDICATED THAT THE STATE UOULD 8E APPLYING TO THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL FOR A CERTIFICATE 1N TERMS OF 530 OF THE INTERNAL SECURITY ACI HHICH ALLOWS THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL TO PREVENT THE ACCUSED FROM MAKING A BAIL APPLICATION WHEN HE DEEMS IT TO BE IN THE XNTEREST OF THE SECURITY OF THE STATE. SEBSEQUENTLY 1N FEBRUARY THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL ISSUED A CERTIFICATE IN TERMS OF 530 IN RESPECT OF ALL FIVE OF THE ACCUSED.

THE ACCUSED THEN BROUGHT AN APPLICATION TO THE SUPREME COURT TO CHALLENGE THE VALIDITY OF THE CERTIFICATE. THE APPLICATION WHICH HRS ARGUED 1N MAY 1987 BEFORE MR. JUSTICE STRYDOM HAS UNSUCCESSFUL.

COSATU AND THE MASS DEMOCRATIC MOVEMENT ARE BEING HIT BY A NEW WAVE OF REPRESSION, WHILE HUNDREDS OF OUR COMRADES ARE ON HUNGER STRIKE IN VLOK'S JAILS IN PROTEST AGAINST THEIR CONTINUED DETENTION UNDER THE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS.

CUSATU EDUCATION SECRETARY, KHETSI LEHOKO, HAD HIS CAR WINDSCREEN SMASHED IN MAYFAIR THIS WEEK, WHILE IT WAS PARKED OUTSIDE THE HOUSE OF ANOTHER CUSATU OFFICIAL.

COSATU'S RESEARCH OFFICER, RAHMAT OMAR, WAS DETAINED AT HER HOME IN MAYFAIR IN THE EARLY HOURS OF THIS MORNING (9/2/89) AFTER IT HAD BEEN THURUUGHLY SEARCHED BY THREE SECURITY POLICEMEN. IT IS NOT YET KNOWN UNDER WHAT LAW SHE HAS BEEN DETAINED.

COSATU'S REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR THE NORTHERN TRANSVAAL, DONSIE KHUMALO, WAS DETAINED AT CUSATU'S OFFICES IN PRETORIA THIS MORNING. DOCUMENTS WERE REMOVED FROM THE OFFICE AND OTHER STAFF MEMBERS INFORMED THAT HE WAS BEING DETAINED IN TERMS OF THE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS.

THE EAST RAND HOME OF A FAMILY MEMBER OF COSATU'S FIRST VICE PRESIDENT, CHRIS DLAMINI, WAS RAIDED THIS MORNING BY MEN IN MOTORCYCLE HELMETS LOOKING FOR CHRIS DLAMINI AND HIS DAUGHTER, LINDIWE, A FORMER MEMBER OF COSAS. FAMILY MEMBERS WERE INFORMED THAT A RESTRICTION ORDER HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR LINDIWE, AND THAT SHE SHOULD MAKE REPRESENTATIONS TO THE POLICE REGARDING THESE. THE HOME OF THE SENIOR SHOP STEWARD FROM KELLOGS, ONE OF CHRIS DLAMINI'S COLLEAGUES, WAS ALSO VISITED THIS MORNING BY PEOPLE LOOKING FOR MR DLAMINI. OVER THE PAST FEW WEEKS, COSATU OFFICES IN MANY PARTS OF THE COUNTRY HAVE BEEN RAIDED BY POLICE, PARTICULARLY IN THE NORTHERN CAPE, ORANGE FREE STATE, NORTHERN TRANSVAAL AND WITWATERSRAND REGIONS. SOME CUSATU MEMBERS AND OFFICIALS ARE AMONG THE HUNDREDS OF HUNGER STRIKERS STARVING THEMSELVES, IF NECESSARY, TO DEATH IN AN EFFORT TO FORCE THE GOVERNMENT TO COME TO ITS SENSES AND RELEASE ALL DETAINEES. COSATU CUNDEMNS THE REPRESSIUN AGAINST OUR ORGANISATION - IN PARTICULAR THE VIOLENT ATTACKS AGAINST OUR MEMBERS AND THEIR PROPERTY AND THE DETENTION OF OUR OFFICIALS. WE DEMAND THE IMMEDIATE RELEASE OF RAHMAT OMAR, DONSIE KHUMALO AND ALL DETAINEES. CUSATU STAND IN FULL SOLIDARITY WITH ALL OUR COMRADES ON HUNGER STRIKE. WE DEMAND THAT THEY ALL BE IMMEDIATELY AND UNCUNDITIUNALLY RELEASED.
