BRIEFING SHEET 10T_H. Anniversary Celebration of the Handover Of Somafco by the ANgto the Government_of Taggania.

Background

Between 1978 and 1992, thousands of young South African political exiles received educati on and vocational training

and engaged in productive activity at the Settlements of Mazimbu and Dakawa near Morogoro in Tanzania. They were

forced to flee police terror after protracted nationwide student resistance onward from t he Soweto Uprising of 1976.

The central institution established by the African National Congress for these exiles was the Solomon Mahlangu

Freedom College (SOMAFCO) and an array of supporting institutions, such as the Ruth First Education Orientation

Centre, the Dakawa Vocational Training Centre, two libraries, two primary schools/nursery schools, day-care-centres,

boarding and sports facilities.

Other self-reliance facilities were also set up: a 16-bed hospital, two clinics, two farm s and small industries for furniture,

clothing and leather production. The two Settlemnts were endowed with an infrastructure o f running water, electricity,

sewage disposal and a road network. All these facilities, including nearly a thousand dwe llings, were the result of the

ANCIs planning and construction departments. ANC technical experts were assisted by volun teer experts from many

countries, as well as hired local labour.

On J uly 91h, 2002, when the late ANC President Oliver Tambo handed over the two Settleme nts to the then President

Hassan Ali Mwinyi of Tanzania, he expressed the hope that the two Settlements would remai n symbols of the solidarity

and friendship between the peoples of Tanzania and South Africa. It was then estimated th at the monetary value of the

fixed and moveable assets left behind by the ANC amounted to US\$ 600 million.

10th Anniversary Celebration

To mark the 10lh anniversary of the handover of Somafco by the ANC t0 the Government of T anzania, the ANC, with

the assistance of the Batlagae Trust, will hold a celebration on Friday 19th July 2002 at the Yeoville Community

School, Yeoville, Johannesburg.

Two main reasons underlie the 10th anniversary commemoration. To remember the Somafco leg acy which symbolizes

the solidarity and friendship between the peoples of Tanzania and South Africa. Furthermo re, Somafco exemplifies the

determination and resilience of many South Africans committed to freedom, democracy and j ustice. The celebration will

commemorate their contribution in the struggle against apartheid.

The celebration will be attended by members of the former Liberation Movements, in partic ular former students, teachers

and workers of Somafco. Also in attendance will be the High Commissioner of the United Re public of Tanzania,

Tanzanian nationals resident in Gauteng, UN Agencies, the SACC and representatives of Emb assies that gave assistance to Somafco.
