
In wishing the players the very best of luck, I also hope that the games will be good and well fought and that good sportsmanship, as usual, will prevail and that the best team will deservedly win.







### WESTERN PROVINCE

THE Western Province Cricket Board was established in 1959 with 12 affiliated Unions to cater for cricket in the Cape Peninsula, Paarl, Wellington, Stellenbosch, Somerset West, Somerset Strand, Malmesbury, Caledon and Bredasdrop which is about 120

miles from Cape Town.

The Unions presently affiliated to the Board are: Western Province Cricket Association; Cape & District Cricket Union; Maitland, Parow Cricket Union; Wynberg District Cricket Union; Metropolitan Cricket Union; Stellenbosch Cricket Union; Paarl Cricket Union; Somerset West Cricket Union; Hottentots Holland Cricket Union; Southern Cape Cricket Union; Wellington Cricket Union.

There are 3,600 registered players actively participating in fixtures.

The Western Province are the holders of the Dadabhoy Brothers Trophy which they won at Port Elizabeth in December, 1963.

A strong team has been selected for the Tournament and it is expected that Western

Province will be hard to beat.

### GRIQUALAND WEST


THE Board as presently constituted was founded in 1961, after the four racial (African Indian, Malay and Coloured) bodies decided to disband the G.W. Cricket Federation that was the body controlling cricket in the G. West, as it was felt that time had arrived to scrap all racial sports if progress was to be achieved in the desired manner. Though the Coloured and the African Units first supported the idea of one controlling body, these Units for reasons unknown have not come forward to bring about the Unity envisaged and are at present not affiliated.

Despite these bodies being out of the Board, the body has really progressed since its inception and today provides for organised sport in the area known as Griqualand West, and surely one of the largest in the Republic. Affiliated clubs which come from Kimberley, Vryburg, Schweizer-Reneke, Bloemhof and Warrenton-Christiana weekly travel hundreds of miles to fulfil their fixtures. The Boards' present officials, though they have for the time being lost the services of the great founder-member of the body Mr. A. R. Abass, who more than anyone wants the formation of one single controlling body here, are doing their utmost to have and give the highest grade of cricket to all concerned and annually have arranged friendlies with outside Provinces every season.

The future of the Board looks very healthy indeed, and as all concerned with the Board are ready to negotiate with the non-affiliated units in the area to bring them together and form one controlling unit, which as the S.A. Cricket Board of Control's Special Committee that visited the Province last recommended, for the game's upliftment and reaching the high standard desired, all concerned should dedicate to achieve this at all costs.

### **NATAL**

THE Natal Cricket Board of Control, as presently composed, was established on 15th October 1961 at a Conference of District Cricket Unions in Natal following the directive of the South African Cricket Board of Control to all the racial National Units to disband themselves and for the district Unions to band themselves under a provincial Union on a non-racial basis.

Previously, the body had been known as the Natal Inter-Race Cricket Board and while outwardly, the change may appear to have been only a change of name, it in fact ushered in a new spirit in Natal Cricket. There have, of course, been difficulties but it is pleasing


to record that steady progress has been made in the last five years.

Natal participated in the two previous inter-provincial Tournaments and is the host for the current Tournament. At the first Tournament in Johannesburg, the Natal team upset all preconceived ideas when it defeated the favourites Western Province and lost to the Transvaal after having led on the first innings. They were thus deprived of winning the coveted Dadabhoy Trophy by one point. Natal's participation in the second Tournament in Port Elizabeth was not so successful and the team was placed fourth.

At present the Natal Cricket Board of Control has under its jurisdiction 11 district Unions with 99 clubs and 1599 players. It is pleasing to record that the Northern Districts and the Pietermaritzburg Unions have joined Natal this season. The Board conducts an interdistrict competition, a knock-out competition for the winning team in each district and this season a new competition in which a selected number of the top clubs in Natal participate on the league and knock-out basis has been introduced. It has created tremendous interest both among the players and the public.


The staging of the Tournament here is bound to capture the interest of the players and
