was not accepted by Inkatha a meeting was then proposed between Cosatu, UDF and Inkatha to remove obstacles to the peace process. Agreement was reached on the meeting and the date but the meeting did not take place because of Inkatha's insisting that Ulundi be the venue. It has now been agreed as a result of the intervention by the Anglican Church that a meeting will take place of two from each side at a neutral venue.

The attacks are continuing to be extended. It is very clear that the police are involved in this violence. We have heard a briefings to expose police collusion in the viblence in .

Pietermaritzburg. We have called for a Independent: Commision of Enquiry to the role of the police. Recently an interdict was obtained to restrain the police from harrasing the community of Ihpophomeni. EEAQE_QAHEAIQH
