Dear Comrade Mendi:

One of the decisions of the Third Education Council Meeting was that the position of the Scholarship Secretary should be held by a South African. As you know, I was not born in South Africa, and therefore do not meet this requirement.

In addition, since the inception of the Scholarship Secretariat in June, I have felt that the intricacies and pressures involved in this difficult and delicate aspect of the Movement's work (that is, scholarships) are beyond my present capabilities and experience. As a result of this, as well as various personal factors, I have found that the pressure has risen to a degree where I am unable to cope with it. If I were to continue in this situation, I feel that my ability to serve the Movement properly would be crippled.

I have discussed this matter at length with Comrade Makgothi. He has agreed that it is necessary that I terminate my activities as Scholarship Secretary, and take up work of a less stressful nature.

This resignation is effective September 30, 1980. I shall continue to carry out my duties to the best of my abilities until that time.
