Bank records reported to show money used to repay Pretoria THIS SPECIAL LIF $\hat{a}$ 200\231

Australiaâ\200\231s richest man, Mr Kerry Packer, helped set 1p a secret trust fund for the controversial Zulu leader, Chief Mangosuthu Buthelezi, accordin3 to newspaper reports in Brirain and South Africa today.

The fund Is now reported to have been used by Chief Euthelezi to repay the South African Government for its secret doaatlens to the Zulu Inkatha movement.

These donations came to light this month and plunged President De Klerk's administration â\200\230inâ\200\230o &

credibility crisis.

. Reports disclosing the existence of the accounts and Chief Buthelezi's repayments to the South African Government appeared today in London's â\200\230Independent on Sundayâ\200\231 and Johannesburg's â\200\230Sunday Times'.

The  $\hat{a}\200\230$ Independent on Sunday $\hat{a}\200\231$ 

reported that bank documents acquired by Its Johannesburg correspondent showed that a promlnent British businessman, Mr John Aspinall, and Mr Packer selup the \$600,000 fund last year.

The same bank records are reported to show that the trust fund had been used by Chief Buth-elezl to repay Pretoriaâ\200\231s secret slush funds since the payments came to light.

Mr Packer, who is in England, has not so far commented on the bank documents. His stafl were

A member of Inkatha's central committed, Mr Waller Felgate, confirmed to both newspipers that the rÃ@payments to the South African Government had come from the chief's personal account.

The  $\hat{a}$ 200\230Independent on Sunday' reported that Mr Felgate had admitted that 250,000 rand (more than \$100,000) from it had been returned to the Government.

Mr Felgate was reported as say-Ing that the account had earned the equivalent of more than \$80,000 in Interest since the original deposits had been made in September last year.

While Mr Packer has no previous record of being interested in

South African politics, It is known that Mr Aspinall, who owns a zoo in Kent and has a house in Cape Town, once paid for Chief Buthelezl to go on an around-the-world fund-raising trlp. Mr Aspinall recently addressed an Inkatha rally of about 40,000 people on the

outskirts of Soweto.

Mr Packer has extepsive publishing and broadcasting Interests
in Australla. His main assets are
Channel 9 and Australian Consolldated Press, the countryâ\200\231s largest
magazine publisher, which produces such titles as the â\200\230Australian
Women's Weekly' and â\200\230The Bulletin'. He Is a partner with the Canadian publisher Mr Conrad Black
in a consortium bidding for the
John Fairfax Group, which publishes â\200\230The Ageâ\200\231, â\200\230The Sydney
Morning Herald' and â\200\230The Australlan Financial Reviewâ\200\231,

Mr Packer also has extensive Investments In property, cotton growing, grazing and mining.

When it was revealed this month that Inkatha had been recelving hundreds of thousands of dollars in covert funding from the South African security forces, the Minister for Law and Order, Mr Adriaan Viok, admitted that the money had been used to boost the standing of the more politically conservative Inkatha against its rival, the African National Congress.

The Foreign Minister, Mr Pik Botha, later admitted authorising the payments, saying: â\200\234We did nothing wrong . . . | would do it all

for political purposes but for an anti-sanctions campalgn.

Thousands of black South Africans have been killed In clashes between supporters of Inkatha and the ANC over the past few years, with the ANC repeatedly claiming that Inkatha was recelv-Ing help from the security forces. The authorities in Pretoria deny that any of its funding was used to promote antl-ANC violence In Soweto and other townships as the power struggle between the two organisations worsens.

Mr De Klerk and Chief Buthelezi deny any knowledge of secrel payments. Mr De Klierk Is expected to make a statement aboul the Government'â\200\231s funding of Inkatha on Tuesday.
