~ in South Africa before leaving for London in 1952. where he attended the Slade School of Art and studied casting.

In a newspaper interview (Diz BurGeR, 12 _ Feb 1957) Maurice spoke of his admiration for the work of Henry Moore, Epstein, Marini and Manzu. He described his own subject matter as a preoccupation with forms from nature, an interest which could be attributed to the little garden he tended as a child under his motherâ\200\231s supervision. Maurice carved in hardwoods and ivory and cast sculptures in bronze.
