## MESSAGE FROM THE AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS (S.A.) ON AFRICA FREEDOM DAY, 25th MAY, 1971.

The year 1960 was the beginning of an era of the most unprecedented upsurge of the National Revolution in Africa, bringing freedom and independence to a number of African States, and the rapid disintergration of colonialism in its old form. The frontiers of imperialism and colonialism shrunk under the offensive and pounding blows launched by the liberation struggle.

Today is Africa Freedom Day - a day of commemmoration and rededication, a day for rememberance of those who have lost their lives in the struggle for independence and freedom.

When free Africa is celebrating this day, over 40 millions of the indigenous peoples of Southern Africa are still oppressed by white minority regimes in this area. These oppressed nations are waging a bitter and heroic struggle for freedom and independence, and sooner or later they shall join the rest of free Africa in celebrating this day as free nations.

What is at stake, and critically at stake is the defence of African independence and sovereignity, however incomplete it might be; and the advancement of the liberation struggle in our continent in order to free our people from the sufferings of colonialism and neo-colonialism.
