- (3) The venue of the Conference changed last week. at this time the Regional Convenor was in Johannesburg. she was informed by the HQ that th is was done through the recommendation of the tech nician who was going to instal the similtaneous translation equipments. On the return of the Regional Convener she was informed that the day she landed in Johannesburg , that is the day before the technician arrived in Kimberley form Joburg, Cde Feroza phone one cde in Kimberley to tell her to change the venue.
- (4) On the arrival of the first batch and subsequently the \$u-wd ?&u", %_members of the National .:eparatory Committee a jointins%9Mf with the Regional ?repara story Committee was never held until the night of the 24th when there was a crisis and some of the delegates were sleeping in the open.
- (5) Two (2) offices existed one at the ANC office and one at the Kimberley Sun. There was a communication breakdown.
- (6) Allocation of hotel accomodation was changed without consultation with the Reg; onal Preparatory Committee the RPC only knew at the meeting of the $24 \, \mathrm{th}$ who was staying where.
- (7) The Sunarama hotel which has been hired at R1 500 and we believed 800 chairs hired at ?2 has not been instilised. (wmgi; ("A \$9 .A-imklw T-vwg, L UT
- (8) Vattresses which have been hired exorbitant prices are standing full in the ANC :ffice and private accommodation in the Township has not been utilised.
- (9) The Regional Preparatory -emmittee onl; rnew that there was going to be a :rocess; on from the Cit; Hall :3 the conference venue then it saw this 33 the timetable auring the opening session. he ?PC had ad ised agains: the march because no permit as ap; ied for. This confus-:n resulted in an argument bet een the transport officevanc the convenor as to why he (transport :fficer; did no: provide transport to take guests an: Leaders to the venue.

The RPC had organised interpreters but was told by the HPC that only professionals are wanted. Yesterday the RPC was told to organise interpretors $\frac{1}{2}$

- (11) Women Comrades as guides to our guests were organised, but where rudely dismissed by a member of NPC.
- (12) RPC took upon itself to organised sight -seeing for our visitors, but cannot be expected to receive and see guests to their cars. It was embarrasing to see our guests on their own. This is lack of protocol.
- (13) MARSHALLSCEiPRO have been another headache_:n spite of the presence of the PRC officiis the marshalls have gone out of handthey sleep and eat in hotels. The PRO also issues instructions contrary to the ones issued by the RPC. RPC would like to point out that it does not deny its short.coming. guy problems it had were exacerbated by headquarters. The Regional Preparatory Committee would like to apologise t0? any inconvenience. caused the delegates and the leadership.
