

Dear Barbara Masekela,

re: Conference on South African Literature in Bad Boll, FRG

thank you very much for your letter of October 27, in which you expressed your interest in our past and forthcoming conference on South African English literature. For your information: We have, of course, thought of inviting a member of the ANC Department of Arts and Culture to be present at our next conference in December and have invited Mongane Wally Serote to speak here. Although it would, of course, have been better to have someone directly from Lusaka, we at our end have to consider especially the rather expensive travelling costs. It is for this reason that we have taken up contact with Comrade Serote. He has in the meantime, indicated his willingness to come, pending his getting a travel document from the British Home Office. He has also promised that, should he not be able to travel himself, he would see to it that someone else from the ANC reads his paper on the implications of the cultural boycott. We have furthermore, extended invitations to your representatives in both the FRG and the GDR. We have as yet not received any confirmation of whether they will be sending participants.

Recently your colleague from the Department of Religious Affairs, Fumie Gqiba was here in West Germany on a speaking tour. I had organised the trip for him and amongst others, sent him three copies of the printed minutes and documentation of the last conference per post. I requested that he hands over one of these copies to you. Please inquire from him, whether these have arrived yet.

We shall most certainly be sending you a few copies of our conference report of the next conference as soon as it is ready. That will most likely be in the first half of next year. Thank you very much for your good wishes for our conference.

By the way, I should also pass on regards from my wife, Ethel, whom you met at the childrens' conference in Harare in September. I believe at one stage she and our son, Themba, were at the conference together, where your son and Themba played together for a short while.

A last question: Is it not at all possible that one of your representatives who will be attending the conference on "Culture in a Post-Apartheid Society" in Amsterdam (12-20 December) could by some means travel over from Amsterdam to Stuttgart and then on to Bad Boll to be present at our conference? I have heard that there will be many South African writers and several from exile present at this conference.
