SACTU is at the moment campaigning far ankvarhoard legal co-ordinating Board. It should he pointed out that there. is growing militancy in the labour field. This explains the efforts of TUCSA under th armpit of CIA)

sACTU. There is, howevet) grouing disuuasionment which is lobbying to attempt to gain credibility uni over $v9\ ,\ -$

evidenceahdisaffiliatiun from TUCbh.

Then: campaign 3; SACTU for the creation of of a legal overboard Council is in pursuance of the realisation to work for greater unity. It is an attempt to try and coordinate the work effort of the labour movement. It is also a zealisatian of the importance of their partipation in the labour developments internaliy. It should not bu forgotten that the very name SACTU has divisive dimensions inside our cauntry. Therefore there becomes a need to play a low profile role which might circumvent represaicn and trade unions opposed to nACTU might co-operate more with an overboard legal organisation, yhich fosters the principles okaE;351EThis is so if one realised that though there is no specifichbanning Sectu its leadership has been subjected to harraosement not too distict from that of banned organisations. Sactu co#getiy realises that the most important Wht thing is that mobilieuti on of the workers must go on. An analsis of the Riekcrx Commission upon which the 1:81 Labour reforms rest makes it clear that these were geared simply to exposthe trade unions and tnen euoject them to control. It should be realised that strikes in the most sensitive sectors of the economy which might in be the decisivee ones are rendered illegal. Thus it only becomes to elementary to realise that willingness to registe: is a strategic error. It is in this light that ca-operation bettaen the registered and unregistered trade unions becomes a remote possibility. It would be for this reason that one could say that if unity talks do no directly address themselves to this issue it could very suicidal.
