Dear Comrades

Many of you who are contemplating returning to South Africa may be anxious to secure employment and therefore security of income before you actually depart. Given that our Movement is under extreme pressure of work and that we are having to deal with very real serious problems at home in our attempts to attain a goal of democracy and freedom, our offices at home are not ready to assist you in any real sense with the practical side of obtaining employment. It would, therefore, be up to you individually to do so.

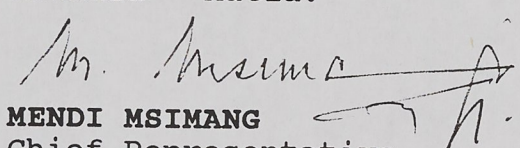
As this task is made extremely difficult from such a distance, we have obtained certain information which will be of assistance to those of you wishing to follow this path. For this purpose, I enclose herewith the following:

1. A guideline on how to set out your Curriculum Vitae (CV). This is the customary way in which CV's are dealt with in South Africa.
2. Three lists of recruitment agencies:
 - a. Senior Management
 - b. Mid Management
 - c. General recruitment

to which you could write directly when applying for employment.

Although I am told that the function of such agencies is to find people for jobs rather than jobs for people, they do, however, represent the quickest and most knowledgeable access to the requirements of the job market.

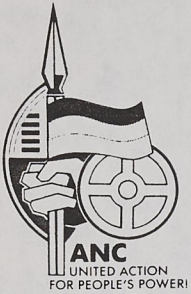

Wednesday, 2 February

To mark the fourth anniversary of the formal unbanning of the ANC, former political prisoners, led by Nelson Mandela, Walter Sisulu, Govan Mbeki and scores of others, will assemble at Victor Verster Prison at 10am. There, in keeping with the theme "Never Again", Nelson Mandela will light a Flame of Freedom, which will be carried by runners to the Dal Josafat Stadium in Paarl, where a rally will be held. Prisoners from all over South Africa will participate in the procession and rally.

The commemoration is being co-ordinated by the ANC Western Cape region, and full details will be provided by Sue de Villiers.

Meetings with Foreign Dignatories

On Tuesday, 8 February, Mr Mandela will meet the former Australian Prime Minister, Bob Hawke. On Thursday 10 February, he will meet the British Foreign Secretary,

Douglas Hurd.

Friday, 11 February

On the fourth anniversary of his release from jail, Nelson Mandela will accompany journalists on a visit to key points of interest on Robben Island. Space is limited, therefore we request all interested media to send in requests to join the trip. Details will be available in due course.

Sunday, 13 February

Nelson Mandela will participate in a series of events in Cape Town.

Monday, 14 February

Nelson Mandela will address the IPI Conference in Cape Town

Tuesday 15 February

Meeting with Ms Margareta As-Ugglas, the Foreign Minister of Sweden, 9am

On Wednesday, 16 February, Mr Mandela will depart for The Netherlands. His national programme recommences with a two-day visit to the Northern Cape on 25 and 26 February, and a one-day visit to Border, on Sunday 27 February.

Monday, 28 February

Mr Mandela will meet Mrs Ogata, Head of the UNHCR, (9am) followed by a meeting with Prime Minister Lubbe of The Netherlands (10am).

The programme for March will be released in due course.

THE ANC PRESS CENTRE

The ANC will operate a Press Centre from 27 February to 10 May. It will be in the Cape Room, Carlton Hotel. This is where ANC press briefings, press conferences, accreditation etc will take place. 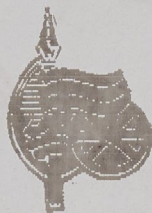
