That further storage space for supplies was urgently needed to meet the demands of our expanding population. In view of the drought and economic crisis in Tanzania, such items as beans, rice, maize and flour were already in short supply and the situation was expected to worsen considerably. It was therefore, imperative to buy as much as possible now and to ensure the storage Space. Cda Dennis said this was receiving his attention and that negotiations were proceeding to convert the old CCM offices into a supply depot and dry store. As most of our food is bought in Tanzania where six million people are already facing starvation, it was realised that we too can expect a very critical period. The following suggestions were made:

- i) It was agreed that it was necessary to do a stocktaking of our available eupplies to note if they will last till June or July when our own craps will be harvested.
- ii) that we make a request to $\mbox{Headquarters}$ for maize from zambia.
- 111) that Cde Wolfie be asked to seek additional food supplies from Donors and he should be reminded about biscuits from Dutch support groups for ANC consumption.
- $1\ensuremath{\text{v}})$ that we immediately take steps to prepare our community for the crisis ahead. ACTION
