1. MINUTES of the previous meeting were adapted.

2. MATTLRS ARISING

a) Transport Sub-oommittee. No progress to
report on this matter. A suitable head of
this department wagbtill being sought.

b) Medical Committee: The Secretary read the
correspondence sent to the medical Committee
and to the Treasurer General's Office. and
reported that no replies had so far been re-
ceiied. i':12.:r:thm: discussion ensued on the
waste and deterioration of medical supplies,
and since this Committee is reaponsible for
all stores, it was agreed, that on Eednesday
1B Earch 1981, the full committee should make
an inspection in loco of these supplies, both
at Bigwa and Hazimbu. Thereafter a full re-
port to be drawn up for submission to Head-
quarters and the Chief nepresentative in Dar
es Lalaam.

c) Txgist for Committee: Comrade Karin has
agreed to act as typist. The Committee ex-
pressed thanks to her for her asaistance.

d) Structures for Inventogz: She secretary
circulated copies of proposed structures
for inventoring, as requested by Headquarters.
It was-agraed that these should be studied
and discussed at the next meeting.

9) Structures for Regional Treasggx: Photo-
copies had been made and distributed as
agreed at the last meeting.

3. CONSTITUTION. PCNERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE
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All committee members had had capiee of this
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together with the two letters received from the Treauror General. These had been read and studied, and as there were no contentious matters, the committee noted the elaboration on the previous constitution and welcomed the new structures.

REPORTS FROM SUB-COMMITTEES

a) Logistics. Lo Regional Logistics meetings had taken place since the last Regional Treasury meeting, and in the absence of Cde Hotsumi, no report was available. The Chairman undertook to inform Cde Hutsumi that the Local Logiitics sub-oommittao, consisting of himself, Ode PrestOn and one other, should in future function in the same way as other production units in this area a

b) Su lies. Cde Habaruti reported as follows:
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That further storage space for supplies was urgently needed to meet the demands of our expanding population. In view of the drought and economic crisis in Tanzania, such items as beans, rice, maize and flour were already in short supply and the situation was expected to worsen considerably. It was therefore, imperative to buy as much as possible now and to ensure the storage space. Cda Dennis said this was receiving his attention and that negotiations were proceeding to convert the old CCM offices into a supply depot and dry store. As most of our food is bought in Tanzania where six million people are already facing starvation, it was realised that we too can expect a very critical period. The following suggestions were made:

i) It was agreed that it was necessary to do a stocktaking of our available supplies to note if they will last till June or July when our own crops will be harvested.

ii) that we make a request to Headquarters for maize from zambia.

iii) that Cde Wolfie be asked to seek additional food supplies from Donors and he should be reminded about biscuits from Dutch support groups for ANC consumption.

iv) that we immediately take steps to prepare our community for the crisis ahead.

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To this end, the secretary was asked to draw up a circular for distribution to all ARC personnel in our area explaining the present situation and the probable effects of a lean year ahead. v) That in view of the inflated prices of all foodstuffs (3.3. meat has risen from 17/- to 24/-) allowances for this to be made in our budget requirements. Comrade Habaruti also pleaded for a meat cutting block until such time as the cutting machine becomes available.

1. GLEELJILAL

a) Regional Financial Statements and reports to headquarters should in future be viewed by members of this committee.

b) Minutes of Special meetings between Treasurer General and hazimbu, on December 23 & 24, 1980, should be perused by the secretary who should report at the next meeting on follow-ups required by us or from Headquarters.

0) Publicity Brochure: The Secretary informed the committee that together with a member of the school staff she was preparing a publicity brochure. In the first instance this was aimed at the schoolchildren of Sweden who are having a special day of fund-raising in the autumn for SUHLFCU. But that it was hoped it would be suitable for children and youth throughout the world. It was agreed that when this is ready, it be sent to Headquarters for approval with the request that we then arrange for the printing and Headquarters for the distribution.

4) Fund-Raising Project for School Library: The secretary informed the committee that Cde Ruth Lazarus (mmasco contact) had suggested that we draw up a project for about \$10,000 for source and reference material urgently required by the students, and which she believed could be speedily funded. This was already in the process of being drawn up and would be submitted to Ode Maindy on completion. Headquarters to be asked who then submits the project to UNESCO.

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Central Egling Office: The Chairman explained weaknesses in both the Agricultural Section and the Regional Treasury in regard to purchases. The system operating at present, where each section does its own purchasing, allowed for thefts. He recommended future procedures whereby the heads of departments must check and count all purchases made for that department. then endorse the invoices, before payments would be passed by his office. This was agreed. It was pointed out that more reliable people were desperately needed in most departments, as, with the exception of building materials, all purchases were paid by cpga.

The Chairman emphasised the need for speeding up the purchase, on a long lease, of the Bigwa Stores. The place was badly in need of renovation to ensure that stocks should not further deteriorate. It was agreed that the Regional Treasurer should join Comrades Motsumi, red and Dennis in the negotiations. Cde Hakgothi asked that we write to Headquarters requesting that Cde Rantao be seconded to gazimbu to fill at least one vacant post. Cde Rantao had expressed a wish to come here and was urgently required to ease our manpower shortage.
