Liaison Group of National Anti-Apartheid Movements of the

Buropean Community. They call for the $a\200\234$ establishment of an Interim Government for the period of transition $a\200\235$. They are also supporting the adoption of a new non-racial constitution and recognize that the National Party's constitutional] proposals -published in September - $a\200\234$ seek to entrench white minori- ty rule in a new form". The 176 signatories represent one third of the members of the European Parliament.

We hope the Convention will succeed in removing all obstacles for \hat{A} « fruitful outcome; that the identified and unidentified forces engaged in fomenting violence will be effectively stop-

: ped. The Liaison Group recently campaigned for the release of

the political prisoners. We rejoice the release of many of them in Bophuthatswana and express our wish that all remaining political. prisoners in South Africa will be released quickly.

We are fully aware of the crucial importance of the Convention to reshape the future of South Africa and wish the participants success in working tawards the eastablishment of an effective Interim Government capable of responding to the social and economic needs of the overwhelming mgajority of the South African people; and of establishing the conditions needed for the adoption of a new constitution for a united non-racial democratic South-Africa.
