RE: SEMINAR ON THE MIXED ECONOMY IN A POST APARTHEID SOUTH AFRICA

We wish to inform you that the Department of Economics and Planning (DEP) in collaboration with the Congress of South African Trade Unions (COSATU) and the Economics Trend Group (a group of South African economists and researchers doing work for COSATU) is organising a seminar on the South African economy to be held in Harare, Zimbabwe from April 29 - 1 May 1990.

OBJECTIVES

The first In-House seminar of ANC economists held ln Lusaka from 14 - 17 August 1989 under the auspices of the DEP and the subsequent DEP consultative meeting held in Harare from 19 - 20 November 1989, strongly recommended the holding of a seminar on the South African economy with participants coming from inside and outside the country and drawn from the Mass Democratic Movement (MDM) and the ANC.

Such a seminar, it was felt, would serve both as a platform for the further elaborate of the economic clauses of the ANC constitutional Guidellnes and as a vehicle for debate and discussion within and between the ANC and the democratic movement on economic 1ssues, and moving towards the elaborat10n of a comprehensive, consistent and a common perspective on the economy.

The recent deveTopments in the country underTine both the importance and the urgency for the honing of such a seminar which W111 examine the intricacies of the South African economy as a whoTe in order to formulate an alternative strategy for a non-racial, democratic and just South Africa.

In a number of informaT meetings held (in Lusaka,London,Luasanne, Paris, and Harare) between members of the DEP and research units/groups from home, the need for cooperation and coordination of research efforts was emphasised. The seminar wll1 therefore, aTSo address the whoTe question of coordination and harmonisation of research activities.

SEMINAR DATES, VENUE AND PARTICIPANTS

As already indicated the seminar is scheduled to take place in Harare from the 29 Aprll to 1 May 1990. The participants drawn from inside and outside the country would be between 40 - 45 and woqu 1ncTude some ANC NEC members as well as COSATU Officials. SEM I NAR PAPERS
