Dear Mr. Mongalo,

I apologize for not responding sooner to your reply of my letter regarding your President Oliver Tambo, appearing at our 1988 Human Rights Week of Nov. 13-17. This delay has been caused by bureaucratic mishandling in the Keynote Speaker Committee over which I had no control. The Committee has informed me that they have decided not to pursue Mr. Tambo's appearance due to political differences with those responsible for providing funds. I sincerely apologize for any inconvenience that this delay in notification might have caused, and want you to know that I resigned my position from Human Rights Week as a result of this decision.

Please know that there are numerous people here that ardently support Mr. Tambo and the struggle of the A.N.C. to free the people of South Africa. I hope that in the near future those of us who wholeheartedly support the ongoing struggle will be able to provide Mr. Tambo or any A.N.C. representative with the opportunity to address the people here. Thank-you so much for your willingness to cooperate in this endeavor, and once again accept my apologies for any problems or inconvenience.
