On this point I would like to know if he may not attend meetings since on behalf of the ANC since the whole world seems to know that we have a permanent representative in Italy.

The conference took place from 23-25 but owing to the route (via Moscow) I only arrived back on the 30th. I will be sending a full report but can mention that I also spoke on behalf of the ANC and at times on behalf of the African liberation movements (our friends from Bangladesh and India were quite firm on this, in fact my presence greatly helped improve the image of AAPSO as a principled anti-imperialist organisation).

Extended NEC meeting

I received the notice about the postponement of the meeting

scheduled for June in Lusaka. My only fear is that the July-August period is a busy one; September is relatively free and then again it is tight. In any case the date should be determined by the

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importance and urgency of the matters to be discussed.

Festival

I am rather worried about our festival preparations (Tunis and

Berlin). By now surely we should be having a clear picture but all I/5:

my enquiries from those directly involved (Algeria and Mhrogoro) did not give satisfactory answers. This will also put our representatives in WFDY and PAYM in serious difficulties.

Tombstones

After my letter indicating that the tombstones for Mhs Ngalo and Ambrose's daughter would be unveiled on the 13th, Zenzile decided to postpone the affair till the 20th. I was then absent but I learn that only Mhny's tombstone was unveiled as the Makiwanes were not present. Gambu later wrote complaining of not

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being informed and I am sorry about this because I thought H.Q. would pass on the information. Perhaps this was a blessing because it later transpired that:

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although we had at first set ourselves the target of £50 (55 + 15), Zenzile later made a choice which raised the price to 90 pounds (60 + 30) for both. I managed to raise the sum with the help of the African brothers and AAPSO.

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although we had gone with Zenzile to inspect Nomabadi's grave, it seems he was aware that the sight we were shown was not the correct one. This he kept to himself but later went to the man in charge and demanded the 30 pounds for Nomabadi's grave on the grounds that a tombstone had already been laid at the correct grave (this was the only thing he could do because I refused that he should handle any of the money). In any case if Gambu does arrive we can always see what can be done. The new grave had fortunately not yet been inscribed.

Zenzile's Welfare

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Zenzile has again expressed his willingness to work in the radio as part-time announcer with a salary about half that paid to full time employees, although the work is almost the same.

The radio authorities indicated that in the absence of "Problem" they would have accepted Zenzile full time. I however told them that only H.Q. could make such a decision.

Personally, it being clear that Zenzile does not intend to leave Cairo, this would have been an ideal solution, and somebody else could then have come to help in the office. Unfortunately the fiscal year ends this month. Afterwards it might prove difficult. However since he is already here there will not be the same problem as with Nmeya. I am only thinking aloud because H.Q. is fully aware of the whole problem but are content to let things drift on.

Passport

I have been waiting for my Sierra Leone passport for almost a year but it seems I may be able to go to Freetown on behalf of AAPSO for a Student's Seminar on "Illiteracy" to be held on the 25th of this month. This seems to be the only

alternative as AAPSO simply refuses to help with tickets unless one  
is going specifically on an AAPSO mission.I suppose the Youth &  
Students' Section will mandate somebody from Algeria or London.

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Please find enclosed herewith a letter from the Secretariat

of the League of Arab States announcing the postponement of the 'Khartoun.Symposium' till the 27th of October, 1975. I also had a discussion with MT Abdulla Obied, one of the Assistant Secretaries General, responsible for Information. He is himself a Sudanese and was in the National Sudanese Committee of AAPSO before itâ\200\230was banned. He mentioned that:

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whilst invitations are extended only to the Presidents of the Liberation Movements (so far only the â\200\230six'), Sudan will be ready to cater for those who might accompany the Invitees, if they find the means to reach Sudan; they attach great importance to the Symposium, and are inviting a large number of foreign correspondents. They hope that some of these might be invited by some ofâ\200\230the liberation movements to their areas of Operation (or liberated zones). Meanwhile they would like that papers should be sent in advance to allow for translation in the three official languages of the conference i.e.

English, French & Arabic.
