The ANC is ready, at any time, to meet Senator Richard Lugar as we have always

been ready to meet any other person or organisation that will contribute to

the speedy eradication of the abhorrent apartheid system and to the creation

of a uninted, non-racial, peaceful and democratic South Africa.

As you have done with your friend in Moscow, communicate our positions as

regards the need to completely eradicate the apartheid system and to cre ate a

new democratic South Africa, to the American people particularly to those

in the decision-making and business circles. Our people have suffered fo $\ensuremath{\mathbf{r}}$ more
