Commissioner to probe allegations of police assault

] Witness Reporter
THE commissioner of the KwaZulu
Police, Brigadier Dries Laas, has asked
for affidavits detailing allegations that
KZP members have been involved in
escalating violence in kwabfakhutha,
south of Durban.

Last weekend, five people died in a single incident in the area, and there has been growing tension since then.

A number of relatives have given statements to their lawyer detailing allegations of vigilante and KZP involvement in some of the incidents. The lawyer, Ms Linda - Zama. contacted Brigadier Laas about the problem.

He confirmed that he had asked for details, and had sent reinforcements in.

The residents of Ward One and Adams who visited the lawyer's office. said they were living in fear of people who claimed they wanted to $a\geq 0$ the area of UDF members $200\geq 35$.

They said they were not members of any political group. :

Pupils were no longer going to school as they were afraid they would be sought out and abducted and many residents had fled the area.
