Thanks for the email and thanks for Rochelle's response. I understand the situation. I am happy for the book to refer to "collection Dr Gavin Watkins". I am still very pleased to have bought the three Motaus. I think they are exciting. I shall phone Nic about the others.

I need to talk to you about what I should be collecting-I appreciate your insight, knowledge and experience. I love Dumile's drawings and especially his works in charcoal-just very little appears to come on the market. I do not like his sculptures as much as those of Kumalo, Legae and Sithole. I may be wrong since I have only seen a limited amount of his works in bronze in comparison to Kumalo. At this point I have concentrated on finding Kumalo's and Legae's works in bronze, cast under the direction of Egon Guenther, and bronze and wooden sculptures by Sithole. I really like Legae's drawings especially the early ones from the sixties and early seventies and I have about 8 excellent ones from this period. It would be good to get a feel from you in relation to Pemba, Ngatane, Motau, Lucky Sibiya, Cecil Skotnes etc and the other artists that you think are under-appreciated. Do you think Mohl is worth looking at? I only have the one excellent Sekoto-which is featured in Barbara Lindop's book It is just to hard to find his early works at an affordable price. What are your views on Villa?

I still have a number of works by Battiss, Preller, Cecil Higgs, and a few contemporary artists such as Kentridge and Gail Catlin and of course my collection of about fifteen works by Fred Page.

Anyway let me know your thoughts in due course.
