This refers to your fax (and enclosures) dated 10/02/94 regarding the above subject which was a follow-up on the conversation I had with you in London on this subject on the 04/02/94.

1. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION OF STUDENTS:

1.1: We agreed that you would send the Charity Commission a copy of the LMT application form plus a copy of Mr Jefferson's recommendations. I subsequently submitted the report to one of the meetings of Trustees (I cannot remember the date although this will be reflected in the Minutes of the period in question) and the Trustees adopted the recommendations which then formed the basis for consideration of applications when decisions of the Scholarship Awards Committee were taken at their meetings or by correspondence in those cases where it was not possible for members of the Committee to attend meetings. This was a procedure approved by the Board of Trustees.

These criteria were applied to all applicants, including Mrs Bengu and Mr Setiloane.

'2 STUDENTS' - MRS E BENGU AND MR DI SETILOANE

As the record shows, she was sponsored to do

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598 H.A. degree in Public Health. In addition to the criteria referred to in 1.1'above, there were, as I recall, three reasons for selecting her: First, she was the only applicant to apply to study Public Health at the M.A. degree level. Secondly, the committee was impressed by the fact that she was the first black South African woman to apply for this rather specialised course: and the Committee felt that it would benefit her people and the country if she obtained the degree.

Thir ly, the fact that she, a mother and housewife, was willing to make the sacrifice of leaving her family to study at that level impressed the Committee to view the applicant as one of positive affirmative action since women were under-represented. Unfortunately, as you know, she spent only one term at the University and did not, therefore, finish the course.

2.2: Mr D. Setiloane

In addition to the criteria referred to in Paragraph 1.1 above, there were, as I recall, the following additional reasons for approving the application: At the time we had one student in South Africa doing Medicine at the University of the Witwatersrand. Donors (especially SIDA) were pressing the LMT to sponsor students in South Africa where, they said, costs were 1/4 of costs in the U.K. They made it clear that they were no more willing to fund students in the U.K. but might do so if iwe sponsored students at South African educational institutions. At about the same time we received four applications from four students at the University of Cape Town (the only other student I remember who was in this group was Mr Ramotshehoa) and who said they were experiencing such financial problems that they might not be ablet to continue. All four (including Mr, Setiloane) were considered at the same meeting and approved for sponsorship. All have since compioted their studies and are contributing to the economic and aeaial life of this country at this critical time in ' our historw '
