In response to your letter AN/LR of 7 March 1973, I am sending you eighteen application forms for Secondary School Scholarship Assistance. Each of eight candidates should complete two copies of this form. The extra two copies would be for your records.

Please be advised that for secondary school training, we refer all applicants to the Nkumbi International College in Zambia. Although the African-American Institute is no longer connected with the administration of that school, 25 funded places are available each year for candidates referred by the AAI. Normally new admissions are made in January, but occassionally admissions are made at other times of year. Also all applicants must be male We would not be able to process any female students for secondary school programs.

Upon receiving the applications, I would have to forward them to Zambia for further processing. The applicants would be asked to sit for a special entrance examination. Hopefully arrangements could be made to administer this exam to the applicants in Tanzania.

Finally, although they do not have their school documents from South Africa, we would like to receive copies of their educational records from your privately run school. Alo their tutors should be asked to provide testimonials with regard to their character and academic performance.

I shall look forward to hearing from you in the near future.
