

Role of NEC and PEC

The NBC is responsible for adopting the list process as outlined here. All powers and final decisions about lists, quotas and ordering will be made by the NBC. The PEC will make decisions about both provincial lists subject to ratification by the NBC. The list committees will be set up by the NBC and PEC at different levels and will be tasked with administration and implementation of the list process.

COMPONENTS OF LIST PROCESS

Ideally, our lists should be ready by the first quarter of 1999
To meet this target, we need the following timeframes to be adhered to :

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Adoption of guidelines by end April 1998'

List committees to be set up and trained by end May. Appoint full time list administrators for 8 months

Nominations to take place from June/ July.

Screening Of nominations thereafter

Finalising of nominations and ballot papers by end August. Also involves Circulating nominations and CVs beforehand

Preparation for list conferences in August - credentials and administration

List conferences from Sept to Dec - provincial conferences to vote on provincial to national and provincial legislature list and give mandate for national list, the national list conference to vote on national list.

Shortlist and ordering in terms of criteria from end of conferences to January

Adoption of final lists by NEC by January

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CRITERIA

The criteria must be guided by our objective of winning elections, style of our campaign and the kind of people we need in government.

It has been agreed that this will be an ANC process and all candidates will stand as ANC members. All accredited structures of the tripartite alliance should nominate candidates. We also need to discuss the representation from both the Alliance and other organisations at list conferences. But there will not be any reserved seats for any organisation within or

outside the alliance On the lists because of the problems of accountability of MPs. Accountability has to be to the ANC.

Candidates should meet the following criteria (additions should be made) :

0 ANC member of good standing and a proven track record of commitment to and

involvement in the democratic movement

Experience or expertise that will enable them to make a constructive contribution in the relevant legislature

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- NO criminal record

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LIST PROCESS EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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The guidelines were drawn up on the basis of :

0 An evaluation of the 1994 and 1995 process conducted with each province
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Discussions at national and provincial strategy workshops
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Presentation to officials and discussion at NEC Election Committee
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For the 1999 elections, we will need :

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200 candidates for the national component of the national assembly list and 200
candidates made up of the smaller provincial to national list.
Candidates for provincial legislatures

The guiding principle on which these guidelines are based is that a list process should
combine maximum democracy with strategic political intervention. This is the only way
to ensure that the list has legitimacy and broad acceptance.

This document goes into detail on a number of issues as follows:

Criteria for candidates and for the overall list
Process for nominations
Screening
List conferences: delegations and process
Shortlist and ordering
Powers and functions of list committees

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Draft ballot accompanied by short CV and list of nominators for each candidate should be sent to all voting structures six weeks before the list conference.

The list committee should call for objections and review any objections to any of the names before the national ballot is drawn up. Fair procedure for hearing objections will be covered in the training of list committees.

LIST CONFERENCES : DELEGATIONS AND PROCESS

National list conference

NBC and provincial reps to vote on list and order the lists. Provinces should come with a provincial mandate that flows from provincial list conferences.

Provincial delegations

should be allocated a number of votes based on the number of voters in the province.

Provincial list conferences

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Branches should be the bulk of the voting delegates and fair representation should be worked out according to membership. COSATU, SACP, Leagues and SANCO should perhaps get a total of 16% representation. PEC to be fully represented.

EISA should be contracted to run the voting and counting part of the list process.

SHORT LIST AND ORDERING

After voting a short list should be used for national ordering. This should consist of the top

150% of the names required. So if we need 200 names for national list, the top 300 names will go on the short list.

The top 25% automatically go on to the list in safe places to ensure that those with the most support from the democratic process are not excluded. The other names on the shortlist are used for ordering the list in terms of the criteria set out above. This system

will effectively combine democratic participation and political intervention.

This would mean that a few people who made it in terms of the democratic process do not make it in the national list. The short list can be used for replacing people later on and will

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Candidates for provincial legislatures

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The process must combine maximum democracy and transparency as well as allow for strategic political intervention.

The list process and the i-\201nal list has to' have legitimacy and broad acceptance to avoid numerous wrangles afterwards.

o A clear, simple process will lead to less problems later.. .

NOTE : List processes by nature will cause tensions in the organisation because some win and some lose and the order of names is important. Our task is to allow a process that will have enough Space for discussions, acceptance of process, lobbying, Objections, fair hearings, transparency in ordering etc.

These guidelines present a list process based on an evaluation of 1994. Some problems encountered in 1994 are not directly relevant now such as the Patriotic Front and matching our regions to provinces. Other problems in the 1994 process which are improved in this document relate to the following:

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More in depth discussion on criteria for nominations and voting

Better opportunity for effective screening

More-transparent leeway to NBC and PEC for the ordering of lists

Improvement 011 the credentials and mandate of delegates to list conference

Accountability Of all MP3 must be to the ANC therefore the list has to be an ANC list.

Allows for a process to deal with i-\201lling vacancies that arise in parliament after the elections.

- o No history of ill discipline or corruption
- o No proven history of involvement in fostering divisions and conflict
- o No other breaches of the ANC code of Conduct

The overall list should meet the following criteria :

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Geographical representivity

High representation for women. The quota for one third women should be spread throughout the list from the first three names.

Fair representation of sitting MPs and MPLs to ensure continuity and experience

Inclusion of minority groups

Inclusion of SACP and COSATU nominees

Inclusion of MDM

Good mixture of youth and age

Adequate number and spread of skilled cadres to deal with the Challenges of government especially in technical areas like finance and economic development

Candidates must be available only for parliamentary, party and constituency work and must be prepared to give up all other interests

Process for Nominations

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All constitutional structures of the ANC and Alliance and Leagues may nominate as long as an official nomination form is used. The nomination form will have space for a detailed motivation for the nomination in line with the criteria set by the ANC.

o Any candidate must be nominated by at least 5 structures to be considered for the

ballot.

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All nominees must fill in an acceptance form. The List Committee will ensure that this happens.

SCREENING

The aim of the first round of screening is to reduce the number of names on the ballot

paper (or circulated list) and to exclude anyone who does not meet our criteria.

After nominations the list committee should screen candidates according to the following criteria :

The number of nominations received
Sector they represent

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o CV and skills or experience they will bring
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Qualifications in terms of electoral legislation (SA citizen, no criminal record, insolvency, etc)

c Any factor that will bring the ANC into disrepute

LIST COMMITTEES

PowerS'andT'iifunctions

This involves :

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Circulating the guidelines and Clarifying queries

Calling for nominations at least six weeks before closure

Screening nominations and shortlisting in consultation with PEC/NEC

Circulating nominations and CVS, hear objections and deal fairly with them.

Running list conferences and extended NBC

Oversee the ordering of the lists

Gather the individual details for candidate registration

Composition

List committees have to consist of at least 5 senior ANC ofï-\20lce bearers with 5 support
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people to assist. The committee has to have the capacity to administer the process, deal
with conï-\202ict and make speedy interventionsâ\200\230where necessary.

All list committee members and support staff must attend a national training workshop in
May. Resources in terms of nominations procedures will be deveIOped and distributed
there. The budget for the list process will be included in the elections budget.

Activities of the List Committee up to the Special NEC

1. BRIEF OVERVIEW

The National List Committee is pleased to report that all Provincial list conferences have taken place, in fact the last conference happened this previous weekend in the Eastern Cape. All the conferences went well. Most provinces have completed the process of ordering and they have submitted their lists to the National List Committee, outstanding now is Free State and Eastern Cape. These should be received by the end of this month.

List Process

Let us briefly go through the process that will culminate in the Special NEC.

Adoption of guidelines by the NEC

This happened in April and was followed by a workshop of Provincial representatives on the process i.e. the list guidelines (see annexure). Provinces then had to set up provincial list committees to manage the list process.

Nominations

It was agreed that all constitutional structures of the ANC, the Leagues, Alliance and Sanco could nominate, but all nominated candidates will stand as ANC. A Nomination form and Acceptance of nomination form were to be used in this process. To be considered for the ballot the candidate must be nominated by not less than 5 structures.

Screening

The screening criteria is as follows:

The number of nominations received

Sector represented

CV and skill or experience

Qualification in terms of electoral legislation, (eg. SA citizen, no criminal record, insolvency, etc)

Any factor that will bring the ANC into disrepute.

Provincial List Conference

All provinces after receiving the nominations would screen them and refer them back to structures for comment and objections. Thereafter would convene a provincial list conference to vote on the lists. Only the province to province and province to national lists would be voted for at this conference. The national to national list would be forwarded to the national List Committee.

Delegation in the provincial List Conference

Branches constituted the bulk of the voting delegates. COSATU, SACP, SANCO and the Leagues should constitute 20%.

EISA

In order to ensure fairness and transparency the Electoral Institute of South Africa was contracted to run these conferences.

Short List and Ordering

After the conference the PEC short lists, by using the top 150% of the names required. They then order the list in terms of the set criteria, but the top 25% automatically go on the safe places to ensure that those with the most support from the democratic purpose are not excluded. This complete list is then passed on to the National List Committee.

' Consideration

The List process has been driven by the NEC's considerations that:

The process must combine maximum democracy and transparency as well as allow for strategic political intervention.
The list process and the final list has to have legitimacy and broad acceptance to avoid numerous wrangles afterwards.

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This basically explains the process that has taken place in provinces in so far as the two lists are concerned. As of now the National List Committee is going through the national list.
