## Recommendations from different Committees

Adult Education programme has been organised solely to help those comrades who never had an opportunity to acquire education in South Africa. Efforts were made to meet this demand however a number of difficulties harrasee d these endeavours to an extent that we were forced to review the whole programme for alternative remedy. In this regard, Comrades will get a clear picture of delliberations taken by Comrade Makgoti and the Education Committees on Adult Education. Meanwhile the other committees spared not their efforts in search of means to improve Adult Education. The general points suggested almost reflect on the general feeling of the people. These are the points suggested:

- I) More time should be added to A/E periods and that the present time fixed foe A/E classes be shifted to a later hour to enable everybody to settle evrything, specifically the mothers who must settle their babies first.
- II) Teachers should be permanent for A/E and that like the teachers in Somafco, must be given incentives to encourage them but but then this must not be seen as a criterion. More than anything teachers must exercise revolutionary patience that of exercuting their political duties and fullfilling their revolutionary duties.
- III) Adult psychology has been cited as an important necessity to facilitate the process of teaching adults and to help the teachers to understand how beter to approach adults and to relate to adults. This in simpler terms means that teachers need proper training for this kind of work. These points have been dealt with in the report of Comrade Makgoti hence I would urge comrades to refer to that document. Important also, is the fact that students as the most important part of A/E must always be encouraged to speak up for themselves so that their views could be understood and be examined to the best of their interests.
