Progress Report ANC/86/006

- 1 The meeting noted that there was a tripartite meeting in December 1986 and the minutes thereof were not available. It was decided that the meeting should go ahead.
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- 2 UNESCO assured the ANC of its support.
- 3 De Andrade made clarification of a certain Cabore letter; That its contents contradicted her report. Missing were fees for 1988, transport and medical allowance. Cabore included uniforms which were provided under leaving expenses.
- 4 The meeting agreed that all the study grants should be signed by the ANC's Education Officer.
- 5 It was decided that UNESCO should place students at non expensive schools. Private schools are not encouraged. UNDP to consult the UNDP New York to let some students to study in private schools.
- 6 UNESCO will allow primary school children to repeat twice and Secondary school children to repeat once, post secondary school are not allowed to repeat.



- 7 Nompilo Mazimba - parents are now in Harare. The dossiers to be prepared. The same goes for Mandla Msimang. N Mazimba on the list is not known. Thandi Njobe has completed studies. Pulane Tshabalala to be kept on the list.
- 8 Was agreed that UNESCO and the ANC should monitor students together.
- 9 In 1986 half a million American dollars were authorised by UNESCO but were not paid to the ANC. Matter to be finalised by UNESCO/UNDP without delay.
- 10 UNESCO pays only academic fees for children and not leaving expenses.
- 11 ANC wishes to increase the number of children to 250. UNDP to set budgetary ceilings.
- 12 All applications for post secondary education should be signed by the Education Officer or the Secretary for Education.
- 13 UNESCO places students where UNESCO has an infrastructure and where possible students should be placed in groups. Mission to Ghana etc not possible.
- 14 The ANC to be allowed to change the candidates on the project and flexibility should be allowed for interchanges of the study fields on the project.
- 15 Dossiers for 1988 to be sent in as soon as possible.
- 16 UNESCO authorised the salary for Education Officer for 1987 and the post was vacant. Matter to be settled without delay.
- 17 All the Project Documents should be signed by the Secretary for Education.
- 18 It was noted that



- 18 It was noted that the SOMAFCO Inspection was not financed according to Prodoc. This to be corrected.
- 19 Primary Teacher Training Course - 15 teachers trainees to start training in July 1988 at Korongwe. 20 Secondary School Teachers to commence studies next year. UNESCO to get Prodoc by June, 1988.
- 20 ANC to hold two seminars in November/December 1988. SOMAFCO to specify themes.
- 21 SOMAFCO to guide on job descriptions for Regionally recruited teachers and also to guide on conditions of contracts., What profiles are required, gender, age, marital status, experience etc.
- 22 SOMAFCO lists to be prepared properly and be send to UNESCO without delay.
- 23 UNESCO Adviser (Mbengo) to monitor SOMAFCO every six months.
- 34 Mahai of UNDP to circulate minutes of the meeting to all present in the meeting.
