

HG2\COMMON PRINCIPLES\2 MARCH

9 MARCH 1992

COMMON PRINCIPLES REGARDING THE BALANCE BETWEEN CENTRAL, REGIONAL AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGREED TO AT THE MEETING OF WORKING GROUP 2 HELD ON 2 MARCH 1992

- 1. Government shall be structured at national, regional and local levels.
- 2. At each level there shall be democratic representation.
- 3. Each level of government shall have appropriate and adequate legislative and executive powers, duties and functions that will enable each level to function effectively; such powers, duties and functions to be entrenched in the constitution.
- In addition to the powers, duties and functions entrenched in the constitution, each level of government may delegate powers, duties and functions to the lower level of government.
- The general principles of the constitution, including the terms of the Bill/Charter of Fundamental Rights shall apply to each level of government.
