AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

AECC is aimed at helping rural communities, particularly women, youth and teachers, to:

X identify job opportunities

X build the capacity of rural communities to become selfe employed

X network/co-ordinate activities

X build self-sufficiengy

TARGET GROUP:

Women, yeuth and teachers in the rural areas around Alexandria, Kenton-on-Sea, Port Alfred and Bathurst in the Eastern Cape. DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT:

Through research, workshops, seminars, video shows, counselling and outreach, AECC provides career guidance services to people in rural areas, especially to women and youth. This helps them identify job opportunities they were not previously aware of, or provides them with the incentive to develop Skills they already have to help them earn a living.

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PROGRAMME OF ACTION:

- X Materials development for marketing purposes.
- X Visits to schools to assess needs using questionnaires and meeting teachers and principals.
- X Networking with other resources and structures in the area.
- X Presenting workshops for students in, for example, job finding skills, careers decision making, unemployment etc.
- X Teacher support and training curriculum development, methodolbgy and lesson material, educational programmes, policy formulation etc.
- X Career evenings and weeks.
- X Letter answering service distance counselling.
- X Research into human resource development needs of a post-apartheid SA, and the implications for rural areas.
- ${\tt X}$ Outreach to surrounding areas and co-operation with teachers' unions.
- X Staff training and development.

STRUCTURE AND ACCOUNTABILITY:

AECC is headed by a management committee made up of seven members representing rural structures in the area.

The project is presently run by the co-ordinator but a student counsellor and an administrator will be appointed soon. All three staff members will receive training to provide a broad range of counselling services.

AECC networks with other organisations involved in careers guidance and is a member of the Eastern Cape Career Guidance Forum

The services provided are shaped and guided by the expressed needs of community members.

IMPACT:

AECC hopes top provide marginalised rural communities with a better grasp of the alternative career paths open to them and to make them self-reliant.

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MONITORING AND EVALUATION:

The management committee, in close liaison with community organisations and interested educationists, closely monitors the programme to ensure that Objectives and the people's real needs are met.

PROJECT ACTIVITY FOR THE LAST YEAR:

The project was started in mid-1990 at the request of the local communities and has spent the last year refining and shaping the PROGRAMME OF ACTION'outlined above and which is now beginning to be implemented.
