South African Cllllenshlp Will be restored to the cittuns ofall the TBVC states who would have been South At'ncan Citizens but for the consumtxonal independence of the TBVC states. immediately after the testmg ot' the will as envtsaged in paragraph 3.1.3 above.

Reservatton

It is recorded that the Bophuthatswana government reserves 115 posmon m relation to paragraphs 3.1.2. 3.1.3 and 3.1.4.

Land Transfers

Working Group 4 has reached sufi-\201cient consensus on thus matter that: 3.2.3.1 No further attempts be made to tdenttt'y new land for transfer to the TBVC governments.

- 3.2.3.2 Land currently in possession of the South African Development Trust should remath the bands of the Tmst until its dissolution. whereafter tt $WIa\200\234$ be transferred to the SA Government (successor in tttle.)
- 3.3.3.3 The moratonum should apply to all land 1:: the Schedule to the Borders of Pamcular States Extention Act 2 of 1980 which has not yet been excessed from South Africa.
- 3.2.3.4 This montonum wull apply to all TBVC States.

Reservation

Bophuthatswana indicates that such a moratonutn could be perceived as a negative implicauon to be conSIdered carefully.

Ciskei states that the momtonum should not apply to the transfer of land to mdividual communmes who have not LS yet received the land pronuseu'.

111: meeting also notes the concern of the SA Government and the National Party about certain legal and contractual obligations which have to be fuli¬\2011led as well as land purchased from individual South African exuzens which has not yet been transferred.

Disposal/Transt'er of Assets and Liabilities

The pantes share I common view that the usets and liabilities of these states should be transferred to the new government on remcorporauon.

Optnnal Use of Existing Infrastrucmre

Working Group 4 reached agreement that due care should be taken 11: ensuring that extsting structures are optimally used dunng transmon and after remcorporation. 3.2.5.1 It is recommended that all structures and in\201mcuonai operations such as education. health, unemployment insurance etc. should continue funcuoming dun'ng transition, until they are replaced by rauonahzed structures and openuons.

3.2.5.2 Existing in 201nancnal arrangements and transfers should continue

On reincorpomxon. pn'onnsauon of development projects should form part of the nalional/reglonal pnontisauon programme. The Development Bank of Southern Africa which has been closely linked with the development prOJects in these states could provxde a useful semce in this regard.

Good Admimsxnuon dun'ng Transition

Efi¬201cient and accountable admimstration should be mainmned during transition. The current admustration should remain In place until orderly rationalisation takes place as a result of absorption mm a non-racxal nauonal/reglonal servnce. The Subgroup proposes that:

- 3.2.7.1 Adi¬\201slmllon be reorgamsed around existing structures.
- 3.2.7.2 On reincorporauon. personnel ~from the TBVC states should be absorbed into the nauonahregional structure.

Rescrvanon
