This is an im ressive program and one which I eileve South Africa badiy needs. Unfortunate y, 1 do not think the Foundation is a likely source of support. Our South Africa program is concentrated in the fields of law and higher education, and we are not active in any of the fields in which MFI and the Centre for Development of Human Resources intend to provide training. Moreover, the amount of funding required ?reatiy exceeds our funding capacity. Realistically, I think that on y the New York city, state or the U.S. government would be able to undertake a program of this size. I presume you are in touch with the USAID office_in Preteria that is developing training programs for the public SBCtOV. I am sorry that we are not able to provide assistance and hope that you are able to find the resources required to mount this important program,
