Thank you for your ietter of the 18th to me and to Mr. Thomas concerning the training program for biack South Africans being developed by Mane ement Futures, Inc. in cooperation with the African Nationai Congress and t e Port Authority. This is an im ressiive program and one which I eiieve South Africa badiy needs. Unfortunate y, l do not think the Foundation is a likely source of support. Our South Africa program is concentrated in the fieids of law and higher education, and we are not active in any of the fields in which MFI and the Centre for Deveioption of Human Resources intend to provide training.

Moreover, the amount of funding required ?reatiy exceeds our funding capacity. Reaiisticaiiy, I think that on y the New York city, state or the U.S. government would be abie to undertake a program of this size. I presume you are in touch with the USAID office_in Preteria that is deveioping training programs for the publiic SBCTOV. I am sorry that we are not able to provide assistance and hope that you are abie to find the resources required to mount this important program,
