




MAO TSE-TUNG AND CHIMURENGA by Paresh Pandya

Brief history and background of Skotaville Publishers



In November 1982, a number of dedicated and well-known Black writers, under the auspices of the African Writers Association, established the first indigenous publishing house in South Africa — Skotaville Publishers, named after the African publishing pioneer, T.D. Mweli Skota.

Mweli Skota, a founder editor of ABANTUBATHO, an independent newspaper which he edited in the late 1920's, and editor-publisher of the first ever AFRICAN FOLKS WHO'S WHO in the 1930's, was the inspiration for Skotaville's emergence. He was a printer, a designer, publisher, researcher and writer. It is perhaps for his incisive thoughts and visionary leadership that he is remembered most.

"The backbone of any nation is business and if we are to be respected by other people; and if we must be strong and independent then we must make a start now." That was in March 1932.
