




## "Bring the Spectators Back to the Game"





#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

In his first season of senior cricket, aged 14, he scored over 1,000, which included six centuries.

At 19, playing for Croxley against Mariedahl, in Cape Town, he scored 225 in just under 70 minutes, in a one day game. (28 sixes and 10 fours.) The first hundred came in 25 minutes, and 200 in 65 minutes. He began his innings with 5 successive sixes.

In 1954, he scored 46 in an 8-ball over for St. Augustine — 6-6-6-6-6-4-6.

Up to 1959, he had scored 80 centuries, followed by 2 more in 1960 before departure to England in March.

Best bowling feat -9/2 for St. Augustine against Heatherley in the 1949-50 season.

For S.A. Coloureds against S.A. Malays, he scored 153 (run out) in the Johannesburg Inter-Race Tournament — 10th April, 1956.

His first 50 came in 35 minutes, century in 70 minutes, and his next fifty in 20 minutes.

On the East African tour as captain of the S.A. team, he scored 50 and over in every match, which included a brilliant 139 in the First Test, followed by 96 in the Second Test.

After only two county games for Worcestershire he was awarded a county cap. He scored two centuries in those games, against Essex. (1965)

For A. E. R. Gillingham's XI against the Australians in 1964, he hit 119 in 90 minutes. (4 sixes and 18 fours.)

In Nairobi, for the Commonwealth XI he scored a century in 64 minutes against East Africa. The last 50 came in 19 minutes off 15 deliveries. He hit four successive sixes.

In his first and third season for Middleton (Central Lancashire League), he topped the batting averages of the League. He pipped Garfield Sobers in the first season for first place.
