(72) The State, in its jnternational relations, shall be governod by the principles of national independence, respect for human rights, the rights of peoples to self-determination and independence, equality among ctates., the peaceful settlement of disputes, support for general disarmament and the promotion of international peace and co-operation.

(3) The Government shall prescnt all human rights treatlies to the National Assespbly as soon as they have been opened for zignature, ratification or accession together with a statement of its policy towards them. -
